

Congress short-sighted to ax Super Collider project

I am writing in response to Congress' cancellation of funding for the Superconducting Super Collider. This most ambitious project had the potential to vastly broaden modern understanding of the physical world. Even though it was only one-fifth completed, many advances in superconductor and computer technologies arose from its development. All arguments against the SSC falter in light of its potential to increase mankind's knowledge. Opponents of the project claim it was a frivolous, "big science" project. These comments are reminiscent of such claims of high school flunkies as "I'll never use math in the real world."

True, the SSC was an expensive project, but the days of serendipitous scientific discovery are long since past, and any profound conceptual advancement will come only after great expenditures of time and money. The scientific necessity of the SSC is this: The present model of the universe has some large, disturbing holes in it. Specifically, no one is sure why things weigh as much as they do. The SSC could have helped unveil such mysteries.

In addition to the blow to scientific inquiry Congress delivered with the cancellation of this project, America will lose credibility in the world scientific community. Countries which offered to provide economic support for the project such as Japan and France will view America as an unreliable partner and be reluctant to form future alliances with the U.S. In terms of \$4 trillion debt, the cancellation of this project is little more than a public relations maneuver intended to deflect growing public hostility towards a fiscally irresponsible legislature. In short, Congress is a collection of shortsighted fools who cannot grasp the concept of delayed gratification.

No correlation between pedophilia, homosexuality

In the October 14 Mail Call, Grant Ruple wrote that the North American Man/ Boy Love Association is a member of the International Lesbian and Gay association, then attempted to characterize the entire gay rights movement as a pedophile's movement as well. He took his information from Leo's article "Pedophiles in the schools" in the October 11 issue of U. S. News and World Report, but neglected to mention Leo's admission that "a great many lesbians and gays detest NAMBLA."

Indeed, with as many gay and lesbian people as I have asked, I have yet to find someone who approves of sex with minors. Whether it is same-sex contact or otherwise, the general consensus is that pedophilia is a completely separate issue and that it's wrong. It should be no surprise that the large majority of all child molesters are heterosexual. After all, a majority of all people are heterosexual. For the neurologically challenged, this means there is no correlation between homosexuality and pedophilia whatsoever!

The adult can easily take advantage of a child's underdeveloped sense of judgement, presenting a serious danger to the child's well-being. This moral dilemma doesn't exist for consenting adults.

Hence, the 'slippery slope' metaphor is inapplicable in this case, and its use here is a fallacy of inductive logic. The gay rights issue should stand or fall on its own merits.
