

Honky-tonk heartbreaker Alan Jackson does a soulful rendition of "Tequila Sunrise."

And one of the most powerfully creative forces in country music, Vince Gill, gives a passionate version of "I Can't Tell You Why.

The unique vocal talents of each performer can be heard on each cut; however, the album manages to retain the essence of the Eagles' sound.


