



Spurs, Warriors set to begin NBA season

SAN ANTONIO — The competition is familiar — the San Antonio Spurs versus longtime nemesis Golden State as the teams open their NBA season Friday night.

But oh, how things change. For the first time in nearly two years the Spurs are entering a regular-season game with no players sitting out or slowed by serious injuries.

The Warriors, though, are hobbled in a big way. Guards Tim Hardaway and Sarunas Marciulionis are out all season with knee injuries and top scorer Chris Mullin is out for six weeks with a hand injury. Top draft pick Chris Webber has a sprained ankle and is doubtful for Friday.

Still, the Spurs insist, they won't be writing off Golden State when the teams meet at the new Alamodome.

"We'll have to do our work," said Spurs coach John Lucas. "They're a very good team. They missed some players last year and did pretty good."

Very good against the Spurs. The Warriors defeated San Antonio 3-1 in their 1992-93 season matchups.

The Spurs expect Warriors point guard Avery Johnson, who played the position for San Antonio last season, to come to Texas ready to prove the Spurs lost a good thing when they refused to offer him a guaranteed contract.

"Yeah, it's a big game; everything speaks for itself," Johnson said in Thursday's San Antonio Express-News.

The Spurs are expected to rely on Eric "Sleepy" Floyd at the point.

Lucas hasn't ruled out roster changes, but said he's prepared to go with the players he has for now.

"I've got to give them the opportunity to see whether they can do it or not," he said.

A&M men golfers to play in Austin

freshman forward Yvette Okler and freshman goalkeeper Sunny McConnell helped Texas A&M win 13 of their last 15 games. Okler scored four goals against the University of Texas and was a key in the win over the University of New Mexico last weekend during the Aggeland Invitational, winning the first-year A&M tournament's offensive Most Valuable Player Award.

"I was surprised at how we did. I didn't think we were going to win so many games," Okler said. "I just tried to push myself, (and) as my self confidence improved, my play got better."

McConnell was one of the biggest question marks for the Lady Aggies Guerrieri said.

"I knew her (McConnell) for a few years, and I had some concerns about her play," he said. "But all the shortcomings that we thought she had, she more than overcame them."

McConnell said that her play improved because she had to battle with her backups all year to keep her job.

She said that she was pleased that her hard work paid off when she was chosen to the Aggeland Invitational All-Tournament team.

Guerrieri said that the 2-0 win over the University of New Mexico at the Aggeland Invitational gave Texas A&M national recognition.

"That was a matchup between the top two first-year teams in the nation," he said. "And we dominated them from the starting whistle to the last whistle."

Because Texas A&M only recruited one forward, the forward position was the biggest uncertainty for the Lady Aggies at the start of the season, but Guerrieri said that Texas A&M was lucky that two walk-on forwards junior Anna Whitehead and freshman Kristen Koop made big contributions for the Lady Aggies.

Because the Lady Aggies will only lose senior Rennie Rebe from this year's squad, which is ranked 10th in the NCAA south region, Guerrieri said he is optimistic about next year's team.

"Our recruiting is going well. We expect to sign five of the top seven recruits in Texas," he said. "And if we sign them, next year we will be on the bubble to make the NCAA playoffs."

"But in two years we will be true playoff contenders."

Rebe said she will miss the team, but is confident that in 10 years Texas A&M will have the best women's soccer program in the nation.

Guerrieri agrees with Rebe, and said that the Lady Aggies are on a pace to be a perennial soccer power.

"The chances of a national title in 10 years is not unrealistic."
