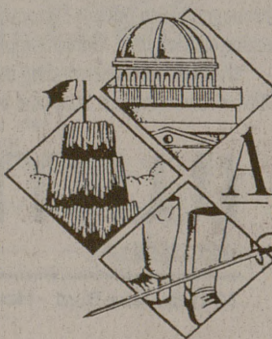

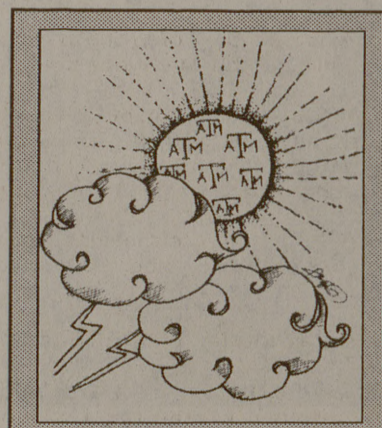

Bobbitt says he forgives wife for cutting off penis

NEW YORK — John Bobbitt said he forgives his wife for cutting off his penis and accusing him of sexual assault and that he still carries her picture in his wallet.

Bobbitt, in his first media interview since the June 23 attack, said he was the one abused in the couple's four-year marriage, which saw two separations and two reconciliations.

He said his wife, Lorena, would hit him "if something didn't go her way. She was always the volatile one."

Bobbitt, 26, spoke to the syndicated TV program "American Journal" in an interview scheduled for broadcast Monday and Tuesday.

Mrs. Bobbitt, 24, of Manassas, Va., claims her husband repeatedly abused her and that she cut off his penis after he forced her to have sex.

Two days earlier, Mrs. Bobbitt asked about court protection from her husband, but left without going to a judge, a court counselor testified at the trial.

Mrs. Bobbitt is considering a temporary insanity plea at her malicious wounding trial, scheduled for Nov. 29.

Bobbitt, a part-time laborer and bar doorman, was acquitted last week of marital sexual assault. He said he forgives his wife for her actions.

"I think about her. I'm not angry with her," he said. "I feel what she did was wrong, but I'm a very forgiving person."

The couple has filed for divorce, but Bobbitt said he still carries his wife's picture and a reconciliation wasn't impossible.

"It depends. It would take a lot to get us back together as far as counseling you know, working things out," he said.

Bookstore owner fed up with Limbaugh

SANTA CRUZ, Calif. — Mayor Neal Coonerty thinks Rush Limbaugh's "See, I Told You So" is worth its weight in baloney — about \$8.40. So he's donating part of the proceeds from the copies he sells at his bookstore to the liberal causes Limbaugh hates.

Coonerty, who owns Bookshop

Santa Cruz, said he is fed up with the conservative radio commentator's attacks on Santa Cruz as a left-leaning city.

So he's selling the book for the regular price of \$23 but donating the difference between that price and the \$8.40 "value" to the National Organization for Women and the Santa Cruz AIDS Project. The book weighs 1.4 pounds.

"We wanted to turn him into a liberal fund-raiser," said Coonerty, who will lose \$5.60 per book.

In the past, Limbaugh has described Santa Cruz, home to a campus of the University of California, as a "true haven for fuzzy-thinking, ultra-left-wing liberals... and arrogant politicians with absolutely no business sense."

A spokesman for Limbaugh declined to comment Monday.

the trust of students.

"At some point, I would hope that I too could develop the kind of relationship that Koldus had with the students here," he said.

Harmon said many A&M students asked him why he would want to leave Pittsburgh and come here.

"I try not to limit myself," he

said. "I always look for an enhanced professional opportunity, and this is an excellent opportunity."

He said the administrative changes going on now will have an impact on the future of Texas A&M.

"This is one of the reasons I see A&M on the threshold," he said. "It is at a critical juncture," he said.

Harmon is the fourth of six candidates to be interviewed for the position.

The search committee is expected to make a decision by early next semester.
