# Constitution to end apartheid in South Africa

KEMPTON PARK, South - After a frantic day of bargaining, the government and African National Congress put the final touches Wednesday on a constitution that ends apartheid by giving blacks equal rights for the first time.

Final agreement by the 21 parties at the talks came late Wednesday to applause from the weary delegates. A signing ceremony in which party leaders will endorse the constitutional package began soon afterward.

A smiling Nelson Mandela, the ANC leader, shook the hand of President F.W. de Klerk as he walked to his seat for the ceremony.

'The day of liberation has been uppermost in our minds," Mandela, the longtime political prisoner likely to become South Africa's first black president, said earlier on state-run television.


