'All he keeps talking about is seeing that plane coming at him," said Peters' wife, Joyce. "He tried to get out of the way as best he could, but there wasn't much he could do and it hit his ankle.'

Killed were Elliot Klein, 49, of Rhinebeck, N.Y., the pilot of the sin gle-engine Cherokee Piper Warrior II; his 18-year-old son, Jonas, a student at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology; fellow MIT studen Christina Park, 18, of Auburn, Wash.; and Jean Kimball, 45, of Pine

The accident happened as the Piper was flying at about 120 mp 7,000 feet over Northampton Airport, en route to Boston from Pough

keepsie, N.Y. The students were returning to school. Peters, a former Army paratrooper who had logged 37 sport jump in the past year, told authorities he leaped from a single-engine Cessor 206 at about 8,000 feet. Within moments, he saw the Piper heading straight at him, according to Jeff Guzzetti, a National Transportation

Safety Board inspector.
Peters, 51, of Westfield, lost a boot and flipped head over heels, but managed to open his parachute at about 4,000 feet.
"As he was floating to Earth . . . he saw this airplane spiralling to the

ground," Guzzetti said. "It was almost like something in a movie. It wasn't real," said John

Stergakis, of West Hartford, Conn., who was waiting to take his first ever jump at the airport later that afternoon. The Piper's wreckage lay Monday in woods one mile from the air port, its nose dug into the ground and its wing wrapped around a tree. The 3-foot-tall aluminum tail fin and part of its rudder were ripped of Guzzetti said it was not yet known whether the tail was ripped off b

the collision with Peters or the impact with the ground. Investigators said they don't know why the pilots were unawared

The sky-diving plane carrying a pilot and four other parachutists redioed controllers at nearby Bradley International Airport in Windson Locks, Conn., to warn other planes of the impending jump. It was no known if Klein was complying with flight rules by keeping his radii tuned for such warnings as he entered the designated jump zone. The zone extended three miles over Northampton airport in all directions.
