Panhellenic wraps-up annual clothing drive

Texas A&M University's Panhellenic Council is concluding its three-week annual clothing drive today.

Panhellenic Council President Stephanie Johnson said all of Texas A&M's 11 sororities are participating in this year's drive, which benefits the homeless people of Bryan and College Station.

"We want to donate the clothes to the mission because we'll know that our donations are staying in the Bryan and College Station area," she said.

The Panhellenic Council recently completed a two-week long food drive, during which it collected more than 200 cans of food for the Brazos Valley Food Bank.

The food drive was held earlier than the clothing drive in order to collect food in time for Thanksgiving, Johnson said.

"Around the holidays, we realize how fortunate we are, and I think it's a really good time to give something back to the community," she said.

Conklin said the clothing and food drives are important to the sororities because of the support they give to the community.

"The drives have both been very successful projects," she said. "We've been really happy to help out the community in any way we can, and we're proud that we can make a difference."

Casey Conklin, Greek Activities chair for the Panhellenic Council, said the council has collected about five bags of clothing so far and plans to receive many more during today's final clothing collection.

"Last semester, we collected over 40 bags of clothes and shoes in all, and this time we're expecting at least that big a turnout," she said.

Tanning salons turn erotic with nude dancers, private rooms

AUSTIN - The latest adult business to hit Texas may be offering more skin than sun, authorities say.

In Austin and cities across Texas, the newest twist in erotic entertainment is the adult tanning salon - a back-room business where naked women dance in small, private quarters.

Despite the salons' names, however, the tanning beds are rarely used, police say.

"There is no tan to it. Some don't even have the booths plugged in," senior Austin police sergeant Jack Kelley told the Austin American-Statesman.

"They are there for an explicit sexual show," he said.

Adult tanning salons are relatively new. They are patterned after established, nonsexual tanning businesses to gain respectability, Kelley said.
