



"It's very hard to run a station with all volunteers," he said. Hughes said KANM submitted a FCC license application in 1991 but is still waiting for an answer. "I've been told it takes a long time for anyone to get an FCC license," he said. "We are just waiting through all the red-tape to get it." However, the radio station may have to wait even longer than expected. James Crutchfield, FCC Supervisory Program Analyst, said he cannot locate KANM's application, but it does not mean the FCC does not have it. "At this point, my assumption is they don't have anything," he said. If the application cannot be located, KANM will have to reapply. "They will have to start from scratch," Crutchfield said. Starting from scratch involves writing to the FCC, asking permission to broadcast on an unused portion of the FM dial.

If more than one station seeks a particular dial position in an area, the FCC determines the best candidate. "You are talking about a process that could take anywhere from 10 months to a couple of years," Crutchfield said. He said when stations compete for a single position, the FCC must decide which one will serve the public best. The decision is sometimes based on how many stations similar to the one seeking a license are already broadcasting in the area, Jackson said. "Unique stations have an advantage in that respect," he said. Hughes said KANM is definitely unique. "Anything that is not on the radio around here, we will put on the air," he said. KANM, whose programming is determined mainly by the announcers themselves, originated in 1973 as student-government radio, Hughes said. It now runs 24 hours a day. "Some people think we are one of the longest running cable radio stations in the United States," he said. "I honestly hope we can be on the air in a year."

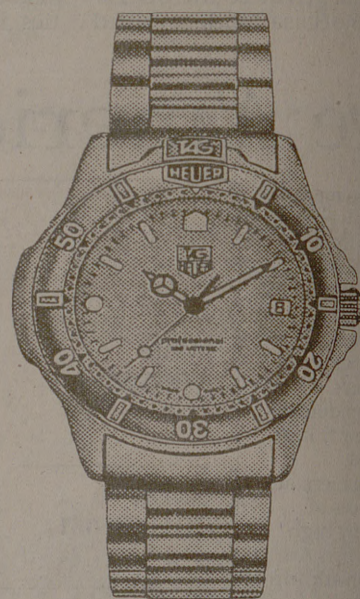
