Texas Super Bowl takes a tumble
Houston fails to advance to AFC championship game

HOUSTON — Joe Montana has the Kansas City Chiefs a game away from the Super Bowl, the place he was hired to take them. He did it Sunday, with a lot of help from his defense. Montana had three second-half touchdown passes, two of them 54 seconds apart in the fourth quarter to lead the Chiefs to a 28-20 win over the Houston Oilers. That sends Kansas City to Buffalo for next Sunday's AFC title game, the first time the Chiefs have advanced that far in 24 years. But as much credit goes to the

defense that put Montana in position for the two TDs that gave them a 21-13 lead — an 11-yard pass to J.J. Birden and an 18-yarder to Willie Davis, who had dropped a sure TD in the first half. The Chiefs sacked Warren Moon nine times while Dan Saleaumua and Joe Phillips shut down Gary Brown, holding the backup who gained 1,002 yards in eight regular-season games to just 17 yards in 11 carries. The Oilers, who had an 11-game winning streak broken, haven't been to a title game in 14 years and haven't gotten past this stage in seven straight playoffs — an NFL high.

Cowboys earn victory against game Packers

IRVING—The defending Super Bowl champion Dallas Cowboys are back in the NFC championship game against the San Francisco 49ers again. But they aren't flawless. The Cowboys earned the NFC championship rematch with a hard-earned 27-17 victory Sunday over the wild card longshot Green Bay Packers. Dallas won despite two interceptions, a lost fumble, and untimely penalties in a ragged divisional playoff game before 64,790 fans. The Cowboys will play the San Francisco 49ers at 3 p.m. Sunday in Texas Stadium.

but missed both free throws. A&M guard David Edwards grabbed the rebound from Penders' second miss and drove the length of the court only to be fouled by Texas guard B. J. Tyler. With 0:10 left, Edwards made both free throws to put the Aggies ahead 85-84. The Texas inbound

pass went to Tyler, who drove inside and pulled up for a six-foot jump shot over Edwards. Wilbert, however, denied the Longhorns the victory. The win marked the first time the Aggies have beaten Texas in consecutive home games since 1986-87 season. A&M was led by forward Tony McGinnis, who scored a team-high 22 points and grabbed five rebounds. McGinnis also held Texas' leading scorer,

guard Terrence Rencher, to seven points. "(McGinnis) did a nice job on Rencher, for the most part," Barone said. "He did a nice job of defending him." Texas' Tyler scored a game-high 28 points, shooting 7-of-13 from behind the three point arc. — Mark Smith

three-pointers late in the second half, as the Lady Aggies defeated a struggling Texas team, 75-74. A&M built a 15-point lead, only to fall behind by six midway through the second half. A&M forward Marianne Miller added a career-high 13 points on a 6-of-7 shooting. Texas true freshman Danielle Viglione led her team with 22, and Erica Routt contributed 18 in relief of Nekeshia Henderson, out with a knee injury.

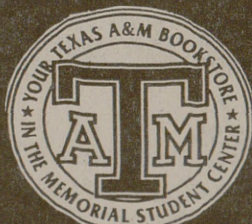

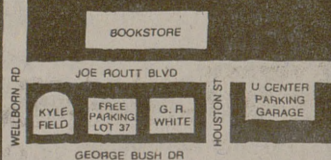
