# Pregnant women charge hospital for illegal cocaine experimentation

CHARLESTON, S.C. — A hospital cocaine treatment program for pregnant women has been accused of conducting drug tests and research on the women without their consent.

The complaint filed against Medical University of South Carolina alleges that the hospital's research was published in a medical journal without the approval of the women or of the review board required for experiments on humans.

Filed Thursday with the National Institutes of Health, the complaint accused the hospital of conducting illegal experiments.

"It is as if since they are dealing with a population of indigent African-American women, the usual constitutional safeguards

don't apply," said Lynn Paltrow, an attorney for the Center for Reproductive Law and Policy.

A hospital spokesman disagreed, saying the program is for drug-treatment, and is not an experiment.

In the 5-year-old program, anyone who comes into the hospital signs a consent form agreeing to drug-testing if their doctors determine such tests are needed, spokesman Scott Regan said.

Women who test positive for cocaine during pregnancy are then subject to arrest if they don't participate in the drug treatment.

County Solicitor David Schwacke said that 40 women have been arrested on various charges since the program began.

Twenty-nine went through pretrial intervention, which includes drug treatment.

One woman pleaded guilty and was sentenced to probation and required to enter drug treatment, he said.

The others were charged with distribution of cocaine to a minor. Those charges were dismissed after a court ruled in a separate case that the charge did not apply to the case of a woman and her fetus, Schwacke said.

On Friday, U.S. District Judge C. Weston Houck issued a gag order preventing lawyers from talking about the case.

The Center for Reproductive Law and Policy also sued the hospital in federal court in October to stop the program. The lawsuit alleges that the drug intervention program unconstitutionally targets blacks, violates patient-doctor confidences and their clients' rights to have babies.

# Commission to vote on toll road proposal

HOUSTON — A proposal to build the state's first private toll road could move one step closer to reality this week, when the Texas Transportation Commission is scheduled to vote on the Laredo-area project.

The state Department of Transportation staff has recommended approval of the project, calling it "feasible" in a draft analysis, as long as a Mexican highway is constructed to feed traffic to the toll road.

Camino Colombia would connect the Colombia Solidarity Bridge at the international border northwest of Laredo with Interstate 35 north of Laredo. The route would be entirely on land owned

by 13 families backing the project.

Camino Colombia President Carlos Benavides said he believes the toll road could succeed without the new Mexican highway, "but with that connector we are going to be that much better."

The draft report says the Mexican road would guarantee Camino Colombia could produce sufficient revenue for a proposed \$46.3 million private bond issue to fund construction and operation of the 22-mile road.

Many civic, political and business leaders say the road will be needed to carry an expected increase in traffic from increased trade under the North American Free Trade Agreement.

But others, such as Mayor Saul Ramirez, state Sen. Judith Zaffiri-

ni, D-Laredo, and the region's Metropolitan Planning Organization oppose the project.

Ramirez has said Camino Colombia "doesn't tie in to the comprehensive master plan" for the region and could spark development that would put a strain on the area's infrastructure.

Camino Colombia promoters have proposed an initial toll of \$5 per car, escalating incrementally to \$6. Five-axle trucks would pay an initial \$12 toll, which would increase periodically.

Several corporations have been formed to explore the construction of private, for-profit toll roads in Texas. Camino Colombia was the first to file an application with the Texas Department of Transportation.

# State of the Union address to stress crime prevention, year's objectives

WASHINGTON — President Clinton plans to expand his anti-crime package with the State of the Union address, supporting a "three-time loser" proposal to put the most violent felons in jail for life, administration officials said

Sunday.

In general, the State of the Union address is expected to review Clinton's first year in office, set goals for 1994 and repeat his key messages on a number of issues, including health care, welfare, crime, economic reform, education and foreign policy.

He will not unveil many new

details of proposed programs in the speech, which aides said has not been completed Sunday.

"The president wants to talk to the American people about what he has accomplished, to tell them how he is doing the objectives he
