

Republican Ogden critical of A&M Board of Regents

Rep. Steve Ogden R-Brazos County criticized the Board of Regents and called for a reevaluation of the entire System in a speech to the Christian Coalition at Texas A&M Wednesday.

Higher education will face funding problems in the near future because funding is being drawn away to pay for other ser-

vices, he said.
"We need to look at ways of better spending the money we have," he said.
"One of

the things I think need to do that does not to take a long look at our system of governance, the Board of Regents," he said. "We

should also stop naming build-

ings for sitting Regents; what kind of message does that send?"

Ogden said he has mixed feelings about the prospects of having a non-voting student on the Board, because the student will not necessarily be from A&M, but may be from one of the other schools in the A&M System. "My concern is to improve the leadership, conduct and integrity of our Board of Regents," he said.

"But I know a lot of students at Texas A&M University who could make big improvements in those Ogden said recent allegations that Regents used state money to buy alcohol also concerned him.

The state appropriations bill prohibits the use of state funds to purchase alcoholic beverages," he said. "I don't think leaders should have double standards."

Ogden said the policy of pro-viding free alcohol to certain high-


