she said. "We just handle scheduling."

Stadelmann said A&M students like Limbaugh because he serves as a corrective for "the bias in the national media."

Limbaugh is also a critic of multiculturalism, and Hensarling said the decision by A&M to require classes in multiculturalism for liberal arts majors will be a factor in getting him to come.

Limbaugh currently has the

top rated radio talk show and has a successful late-night television talk show as well.

Both his books, "The Way Things Ought to Be" and "See, I Told You So" reached the number one spot on the New York Times Best-Seller List.

"I'm optimistic he'll be coming," Stadelmann said. "He knows of the response Republican speakers like Vice-President Quayle and Oliver North received."

The election rally for Quayle was the largest ever of his political career, Stadelmann said.

**Republican Ogden critical of A&M Board of Regents**

Rep. Steve Ogden R-Brazos County criticized the Board of Regents and called for a reevaluation of the entire System in a speech to the Christian Coalition at Texas A&M Wednesday.

Higher education will face funding problems in the near future because funding is being drawn away to pay for other services, he said.

"We need to look at ways of better spending the money we have," he said.

"One of the things I think we need to do that does not cost money is to take a long look at our system of governance, the Board of Regents," he said. "We should also stop naming buildings for sitting Regents; what kind of message does that send?"

Ogden said he has mixed feelings about the prospects of having a non-voting student on the Board, because the student will not necessarily be from A&M, but may be from one of the other schools in the A&M System.

"My concern is to improve the leadership, conduct and integrity of our Board of Regents," he said. "But I know a lot of students at Texas A&M University who could make big improvements in those areas."

Ogden said recent allegations that Regents used state money to buy alcohol also concerned him.

"The state appropriations bill prohibits the use of state funds to purchase alcoholic beverages," he said. "I don't think leaders should have double standards."

Ogden said the policy of providing free alcohol to certain high-

priced suites in Kyle Field should be stopped.

He said such controversies hurting the school just as it is being recognized as a more prestigious University.

"One of the great successes of this school is the fact in the last four years, the standards for admittance have gone up," he said.

Ogden said the taxpayers expect a lot for their money, and current educational system is floundering.

"Where I work, their money is to just throw money at a problem," he said.

well, so we just added another reaucracy," he said.

Ogden called for a reevaluation of the current system which the A&M and Texas University Systems have the number of regents as the Southern.

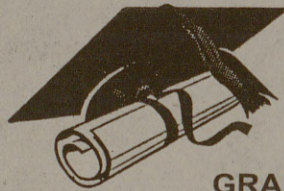
Ogden also called for limits for Texas Legislators, saying that such limits would reduce the effects of interest groups.

"Politicians are under enormous pressure, because interest groups have a lot of sway," he said. "It gets to after time, and wears them down."

"I think most of them go in with good intentions, but changes over time. That's why we agree with term limits."

He said he introduced a bill into the legislature for term limits, but faced much opposition.

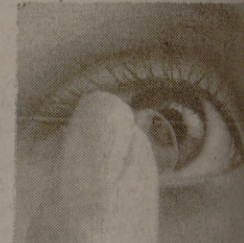
