In '93 the Traditions Council and the Class of '95 officers had an alternative to "shooting" the seniors. A "pull-out" yell practice was held at Bonfire site and led by the junior yell leaders.

After yell practice, Frank Cox, Class of '65 and author of "I Bleed Maroon" spoke about the importance of preserving the solemn tradition of Elephant Walk.

"The speaker was great because he got everyone fired up about traditions like Elephant Walk, and the same time explained to us why we need to preserve these traditions by cleaning them up a bit," Arjan Bormans, Class of '95, said. The reason for the alternative activities for the Class of '95 was that the tradition was beginning to get out of hand. In the past, the unsightly accumulation of trash and vandalism on campus as a result of Elephant Walk was inappropriate for the Thanksgiving game.

"The need stems from not wanting to ruin the campus, and from the desire to preserve the tradition as a solemn occasion," Traditions Council member Kristen Nevius, Class of '95, said. Friends, activities, events and A&M's many traditions formed the strong bond that united the Class of '94 in their dying parade across campus. Elephant Walk gave seniors one more memory to take with them into the "real world."

"Elephant Walk was special because it brought back many special memories from four great years at A&M," Childress said.
