

she said, "But they are expected to fit into a mold."

Many undergraduate engineering students are still pressured to hear of women's problems getting promotions and pay raises, Watson said.

"They think that the women's movement solved the problem years ago," Watson said. "I want to inform them of the need, but to keep focused on increased opportunities."

Corporations have been reluctant to hire more women engineers due to legal and financial pressure, and have been reluctant to draw larger numbers of women, Ashworth-Tsai said.

A survey conducted by the national chapter of the Society of Women Engineers found that the average starting salary for women engineers was \$30,000 and was \$38,000 for men.

However, men engineers earning more than the women were older. "Once women enter the field and management positions, their age salary will increase," she said.

The average salary for women 50 and over was \$75,000, while the average salary for women only \$63,000.

"The comparison isn't a fair one," Watson said. "Women engineers who are age 50 were the trailblazers in the field. Most of the women engineers now have been less than 10 years, so how we'll see women earning and in management positions in the future."

Many national and local programs also provide incentives for women to study engineering.

The Women in Engineering Program has spent a number of years raising money from corporations and government agencies to provide scholarships to women studying engineering.

Fellowship women graduate students have been made available on a national funding.

The Texas A&M chapter of the Society of Women Engineers also helps to promote engineering on campus.

is a group that promotes medicinal and environmental qualities of hemp while condemning drug abuse.

Segrest said if people are educated, they will not want drugs from drug dealers, increasing the dealers' market.

"Drugs need to be fought in the classrooms and not the streets," Segrest said. "We need to lighten up on drug enforcement because there's a saying, 'It's against the law, people want to do it more.'"

But Phillip Meuret, president of College Republicans and senior geography major, said Clinton's plan does not focus on the source of the drug problem.

"The only way to ever get the drug problem is to work with other countries and stop the injection of drugs from those countries," Meuret said.

Meuret said education is important, but the United States needs to focus on stopping drug supply.

"It's funny him (Clinton) on a drug war after using marijuana," Meuret said. "But from personal experience, I know it's no good. He's on the boat where the problem is. We need a good working relationship with the countries the drugs are coming from, also need stiffer penalties for those dealing drugs in the States."

Eric Gruetzner, president of the Aggie Democrats and a political science major, said with shifting the emphasis on treatment rather than incarceration.

"I'd rather not see incarceration, but it's an unfortunate result of budget cutting," Gruetzner said. "He (Clinton) take fiscal responsibility, but it's necessary to work hard."

Gruetzner said a boot camp program such as the one tried in Harris County is an example of treatment for users.

"It's a shock therapy for time drug offenders, and it has a high success rate," Gruetzner said.

Gruetzner said a combination of education, prevention and treatment is the best way to combat drug abuse.

"This (Clinton's proposal) has the potential to severely cut drug usage problem," Gruetzner said.
