CLASSROOM COMMUNICATION ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM (CCEP)

PURPOSE:

The Classroom Communication Enhancement Program is designed as an integral part of efforts to continue to enhance Texas A&M University's tradition of excellence in undergraduate education. In any classroom setting occasional problems which impede communication between a professor and a student may arise. The Classroom Communication Enhancement Program provides an effective mechanism for solving such problems at the level where they occur and by the individuals of responsibility. Moreover, the procedures are designed to effect resolution in an expedient manner.

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT CCEP

A student who has a concern about classroom communication should first discuss the concern with the instructor of the class. If, despite discussion with the instructor, the issue is not resolved, the student then may bring the matter to the attention of the department head of the instructor's department. At that point, a form (Classroom Communication Concerns Form) is completed by the student. If the matter is so sensitive that discussion with the instructor is impossible, the student may report the concern to the department head; at that point the form mentioned will be filled out.

The Classroom Communication Enhancement Form describes later steps in the procedure.

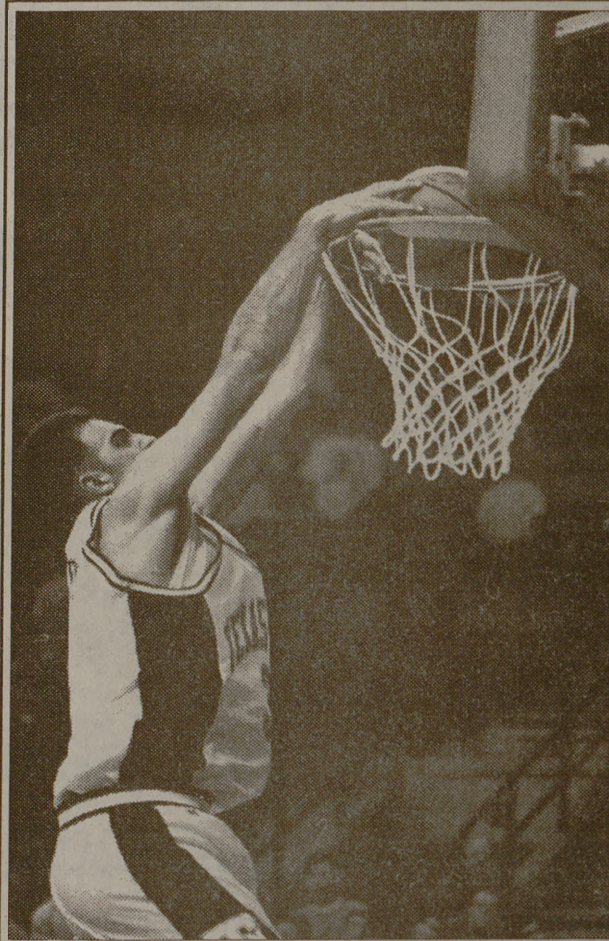

McNeese took an early lead on the Aggies, pounding A&M starting pitcher Rob Thomas for two first inning runs. The freshman righthander struggled with his control, walking three of McNeese's first six batters.

After walking the bases loaded with two outs in the first, Johnson pulled Thomas and brought in senior righthander Matt Sherwood.

Sherwood put out the fire, yielding just two runs and scattering four hits in five and two-thirds innings of work.

"It feels good to help the ball club out and get us a win," Sherwood said. "I know I gave myself a little confidence today."

The Cowboys' starting pitcher Bob Howry held A&M in check until the fifth inning when the Aggies, down 3-1, mounted a comeback.

With two on and one out, senior outfielder Billy Harlan singled to center scoring freshman second baseman Rich Petru and sophomore centerfielder Chad Alexander, tying the game at 3-3.

After a fly out to leftfield by junior third baseman Lee Fedora, Harris came up to the plate with Harlan on first and two

outs. Harlan stole second on Howry's first pitch to Harlan putting himself in scoring position.

The steal paid off as Harlan singled to center, scoring Harlan. Harris' RBI put the Aggies up 4-3. The rally died with Harris on first, as the next batter, junior first baseman John C. flew out to centerfield.

McNeese tied the game in the seventh after Cowboys' second baseman Trent Borque singled to left, scoring catcher Matt Robertson from third base. With two on and one out, Aggie junior righthander Brian Parker relieved Sherwood and struck out the final two McNeese batters that inning.

After Harris gave the Aggies the lead in the bottom of the seventh, they never relinquished it. Parker pitched one and one third innings in relief for the win, striking out three, walking one, and giving up one hit.

A&M junior righthander Chris Clemons relieved Parker with two on and two out in the ninth to preserve the Aggie victory and earn his first save of the season.

The victory improved A&M's record to 5-0 on the season. The Aggies travel to Tucson, Ariz. today to take on the University of Arizona in a three-game series this weekend before returning home to face Southwest Texas State University in a doubleheader Tuesday at Olsen Field.

Norway's Koss wins second gold

LILLEHAMMER, Norway - Norwegian Johann Olav Koss collected his second gold medal of the Games on a day when the U.S. ski team finally lost.

Speedskater Koss rewarded partisan crowd by earning his second Lillehammer gold in many races, posting his second world record along the way Wednesday.

The rabid throng cheered Koss through a blistering time as he became the Games' first double gold medalist.

"Koss Is The Boss," announced signs in the stands.

"What a great feeling to see the crowd behind me like this," Koss said.

He donned a Viking hat and waved the Norwegian flag during a victory lap before his celebrating countrymen.

Koss' teammate Stine Lunde Hattestad won the gold in freestyle skiing over favorite American Donna Weinbrecht the 1992 gold medalist and the year's World Cup leader.
