Two more fraternity brothers charged in pledge's death

CAPE GIRARDEAU, Mo. — Two more fraternity brothers were charged Thursday in the beating death of a pledge at Southern Missouri State University, police said.

In all, seven members of the Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity were charged in the death earlier this week of Michael Davis, 25. The investigation was continuing and more arrests were possible. Charged Thursday were Michael Williams, 19, and Laimon Lor, 22, police Sgt. Carl Kinnison said. Each faced one count of involuntary manslaughter and five counts of hazing.

Five of their fraternity brothers were charged Wednesday in the death of Davis. All seven are being held on \$250,000 bonds, son said.

Meanwhile, friends and family of Davis wondered Thursday "brotherhood" could have turned into violence.

"Aren't fraternities supposed to be about brotherhood?" asked Rayburn, who worked with Davis at the campus library. "I can't imagine one human being wanting to treat another human being like that."

A father of one of the suspects said Davis had endured a initiation in which pledges ran down a line of brothers who fought with their fists. The rite took place late at night on a campus field.

Police would not confirm or deny the account.

"There was irony in his death in that he wouldn't hurt anyone," said Chuck Miller, who worked with Davis on the campus newspaper Capaha Arrow. "He died at the hands of people he probably considered friends."

Davis, a junior studying journalism, was found unconscious in an apartment Tuesday. He died of a head wound, the coroner said.

entire Japanese economy."

On Thursday, the United States announced the trade deficit with Japan shot up nearly 24 percent last year to a record \$59.3 billion, surpassing the \$56.3 billion set in 1987.

The four areas in the new trade package reflect key U.S. complaints. But the package is unlikely to solve the key issue that caused last week's deadlock: a U.S. demand for numerical benchmarks to measure the success of trade agreements.

Japan contends specific goals would require too much interference in business deci-

sions. Takemura said the package might be worked out before a meeting of financial officials from the Group of Seven richest industrial nations Feb. 26. Japan may send an emissary to Washington to explain the package once ready, he said. Japan's strategy is to use the trade dispute from the over, because a trade war with the United States — by the biggest market — could be a serious economic damage. "We ought to deal with trade issues in a diplomatic manner. We should not trade issues sensation," said Koichiro Matsuoka, deputy foreign minister, referring to a cellular telephone dispute with Washington.

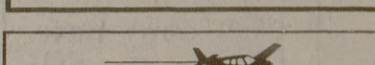
