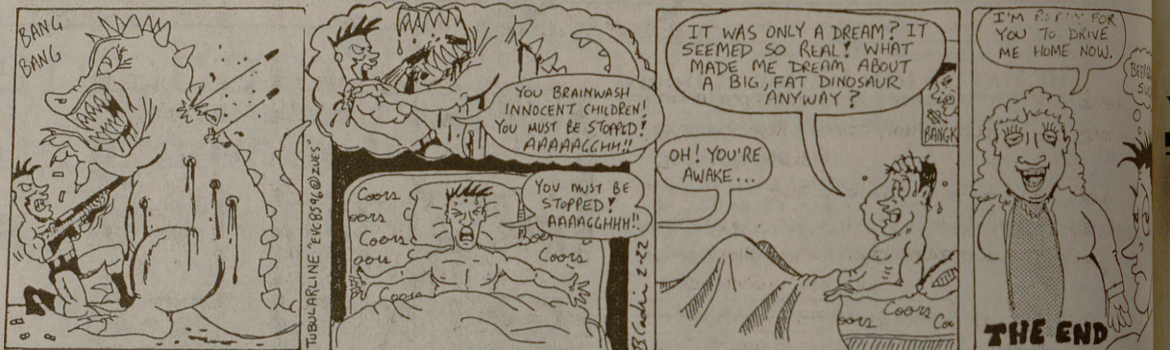

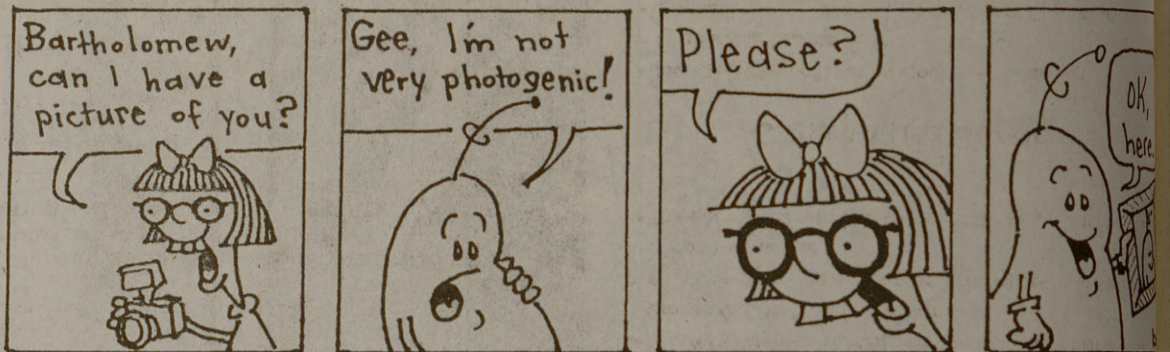

"Abortion was too permanent an answer for my temporary problem," Ezell said. "I never saw or held my daughter. She became my missing piece."

The baby was the only child Ezell ever bore. Twenty years later, she received a phone call from her daughter who is married and has two children.

Together the two have appeared on the talk shows "Geraldo" and "Sally Jesse Raphael" to promote adoption as an alternative to abortion.

"I don't paint myself a hero," Ezell said. "If it had been as easy to get an abortion then as it is today, I might have done it. A couple may decide when to make love, but God decides when to make life."

Bob Wiatt, director of the University Police Department, said two sexual assaults were reported on the Texas A&M campus in 1993. Both cases were incidents of date rape.

No cases of rape have been reported on the A&M campus in 1994.

"It would be naive to think that only two cases of rape occurred on campus last year," Wiatt said.

"In the case of date or acquaintance rape, the victim feels some degree of embarrassment or guilt because they knew their attacker. That makes them reluctant to make a report."

In both reported assaults last year, the victims not prosecute their attackers, Wiatt said.

The University is making a massive effort to educate students about rape.

"Rape will not be tolerated," Wiatt said. "Students must be educated about their responsibility and accountability in assault situations. When a woman says 'no,' she means 'no.' Anything other than that is sexual assault."

Wiatt said the Rape Crisis Center counsels 15 assault victims each month, and not all the cases involve students.

"The educational message is getting across," Wiatt said. "We still have a ways to go. Just because a woman has too much to drink and takes a number in her dorm room does not justify sexual assault. Men and women need to understand that."

Cindy Nevels, public relations coordinator for Brazos Valley Crisis Pregnancy Service, said many Texas A&M students use their facilities.

"The Brazos Valley Crisis Pregnancy Service was created with the intent of providing emotional, spiritual and practical support for women experiencing crisis pregnancy in the Brazos Valley," Nevels said.

The facility is a non-profit agency that tries to help women faced with unwanted or unplanned pregnancy.

The facility offers services such as free pregnancy testing, counseling, medical referrals and post-abortion counseling.

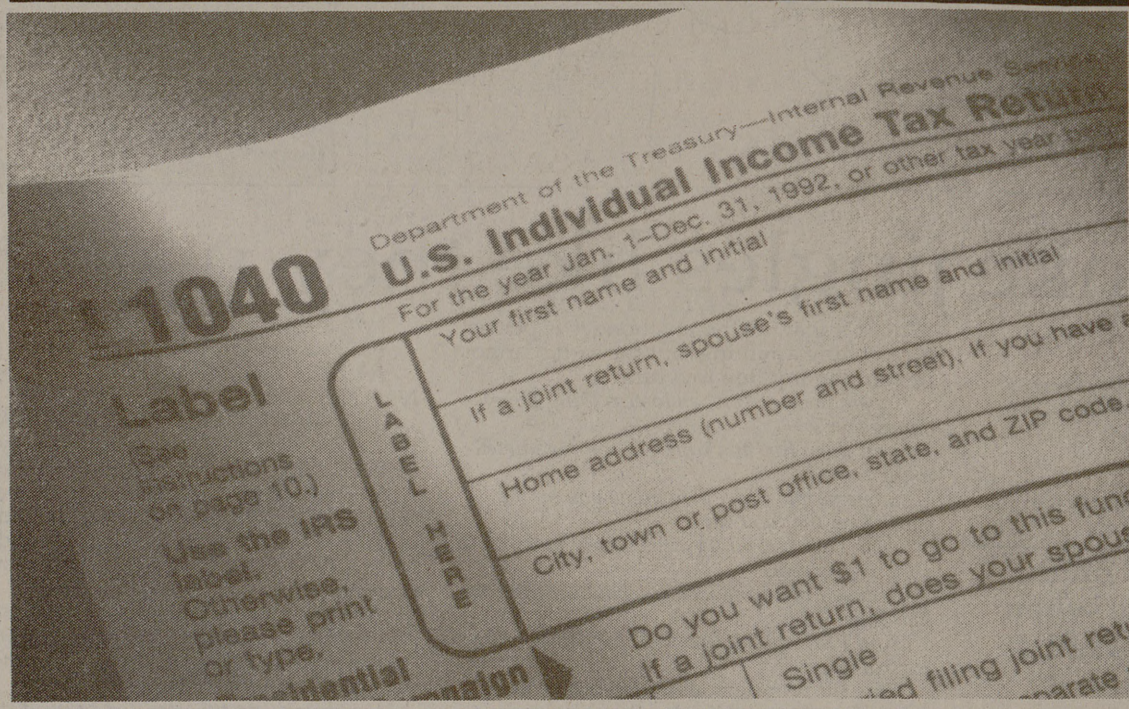
