McDonald's asks customers not to light up in 1,400 restaurants

CHICAGO - McDonald's, the company that foresaw America's love affair with fast food, bowed to the public's growing distaste for cigarettes and banned smoking Wednesday from its 1,400 company-owned U.S. restaurants.

A week after it was sued over the hazards of secondhand smoke, McDonald's Corp. also joined other chains in announcing support of federal legislation to ban smoking in all public places. More than 3,600 of 9,100 Mc-

Donald's stores nationwide will be smoke-free. About 2,200 restaurants banned smoking last year, chain said.

The company urged its remaining franchises to ban smoking. Another 253 stores in Canada also would be smoke-free under the ban.

McDonald's spokeswoman Terri Capatosto said the idea began with a test in 40 restaurants and had nothing to do with the Texas lawsuit.
