and that the Latinos at A&M were all ashamed of their culture," he said.

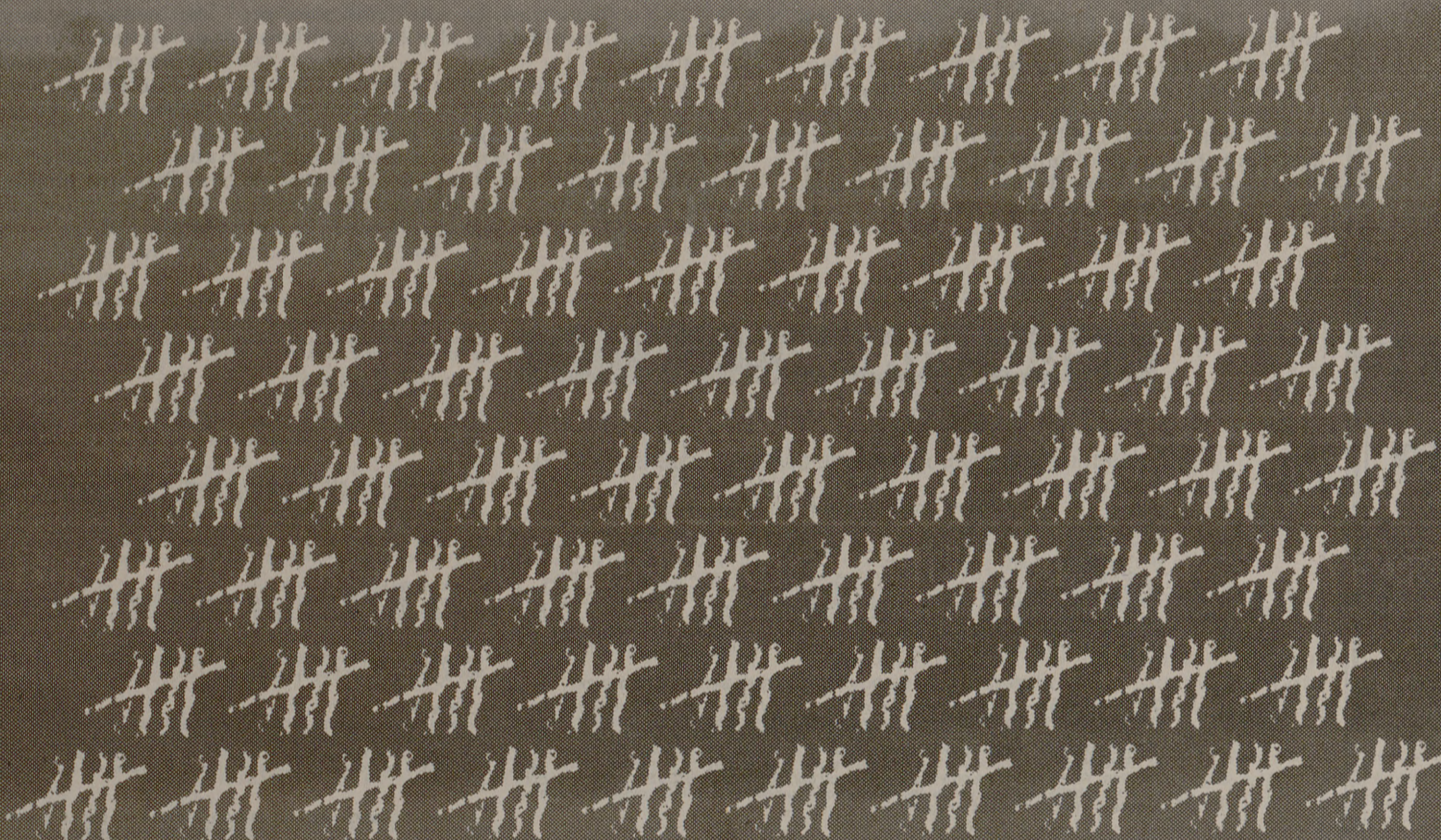
"Now I know that is not the case. I always wanted to go to UT because I hated A&M. Now I will seriously consider going to A&M."
