## Houston will always love the Grammys

NEW YORK — Awards voters will always love Whitney Houston — at least this year. And the magic carpet for the music to "Aladdin" was riding high again at Tuesday night's 36th annual Grammys.

For her single "I Will Always Love You," Miss Houston took the awards for best pop female vocalist and record of the year, which she shared with producer David Foster. The album of the year Grammy went to the soundtrack to the movie, "The Bodyguard."

Just three weeks ago, Houston collected eight trophies at the American Music Awards for her single, "I Will Always Love You," and the soundtrack to the movie, "The Bodyguard."

The torch song written by Dolly Parton two decades ago was one of the fastest-selling tunes in music history. The movie soundtrack has sold more than 10 million copies.

The best new artist Grammy went to Toni Braxton.

Million-sellers U2 won best alternative record of the year beating out REM's "Automatic for the People."

Bono of U2 was greeted with cheers and gasps

when he used a four-letter word in delivering message to the young people of America.

He returned a short while later to present a time achievement award to Frank Sinatra and apparently didn't stray from his prepared introduction.

After a standing ovation, a tearful Sinatra said "That's the best welcome I ever had."

He took a couple of deep breaths trying to read his composure, then said: "This is like being in a ball, the bases are loaded and you're at bat — don't know what you're going to do."

Besides Sinatra, other recipients of lifetime achievement awards were Aretha Franklin, and late jazz artist Bill Evans and pianist Arthur Schnitger.

The academy also honored songwriter Carole King, paralyzed four years ago when a lightning tower fell on him, with a performance by an all-star band that included Bonnie Raitt, Bruce Springsteen and B.B. King.

"Above all else: thanks to you the people, my friends and family throughout the world who have given your support and your respect for 35 years of my life," Mayfield said.

Winners were determined by the ballots of 65 voting members of the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences.
