Yankees rewriting history the way they think it should be seen with their multiculturalism and all that."

Lewis said he enjoys playing the role of Gen. Sam Houston in the army.

"He's one of my heroes," he said. "He's the only man I know of who was governor of two states and president of a republic. The people, especially the children,

can see how they lived, and suddenly, they're interested. Somebody's got to tell them."

Lewis said the period fascinates him because it was a short and colorful time.

"We were an independent Republic," he said. "No other state can say that."

Other groups also imitated volunteer army units and frontiersmen and women.

Ron Harmon said the event is educational for everyone.

"It's very satisfying to do a living history performance for an au-

dience of all ages," he said. "They're able to learn a lot more about it."

Edwards said the celebration is meaningful because Texas history is unique.

"It's important that we celebrate Texas heritage, and there's no other place more fitting than the birthplace of Texas," she said.

The celebration also featured a keynote speech by State Comptroller John Sharp. Texas Independence Day is officially March 7, but the celebration is held annually on the following weekend.

Among the accusations Munoz has faced include a charge by a former assistant that he used a state vehicle in his mother's funeral. Munoz has said he does not recall the incident.

Also questioned was his mailing of nearly \$800 worth of Texas Highways calendars to South Texas politicians, his travel records and those of employees of the department's Office of International Relations.

Department officials began an internal audit in early February into the international office. Joel Alan, a department employee

who often traveled with Munoz, has been put on paid leave until the audit is finished.

Supporters, meanwhile, say Munoz's ambition and eagerness is what set others against him.

"I am convinced that someone is trying to do a number on him," said state Sen. Judith Zaffirini, D-Laredo.
