
SAN ANTONIO - David Robinson scored 36 points and Dale Ellis added 22 to pace the San Antonio Spurs to a 111-103 victory over Orlando on Sunday.

Robinson and Ellis combined for 24 of San Antonio's 37 fourthquarter points to guide a 16-point comeback in the last 14 minutes

in the nationally televised game. Robinson chipped in with 13 rebounds, seven assists and six blocked shots in his duel with Orlando center Shaquille O'Neal, who marked Magic team-high totals of 32 points and 11 rebounds on his 22nd birthday.

Orlando shot only 33 percent from the field in the fourth quarter as the Magic were outscored

The Spurs took the lead for good on Ellis' rebound basket with 2:06 remaining. Robinson then added a basket and foul shot and two more foul shots.
