





clashes after the Israelis lifted a 10-day-old curfew to allow townspeople to buy food.

The killings raised to 29 the toll

in the aftermath of the mosque slaughter, in which 30 Muslims were gunned down by a Jewish settler as they prayed.

Other clashes were reported Monday in Bethlehem, where troops fired tear gas to break up a demonstration at the university.

In the Gaza Strip, Associated Press photographer John Gaps III, a 35-year-old American, was shot in the leg by an Israeli army sniper.

There were no rocks being thrown or anything," Gaps said from his hospital bed. "I was taking pictures of him, and then I saw him draw down and I knew he was going to shoot.

The army said a soldier and a police officer were wounded in Gaza by a gunman in a car who opened up on them after crashing a roadblock.

Security forces fired back and
