In the Gaza Strip, Associated Press photographer John Gaps III, a 35-year-old American, was shot in the leg by an Israeli army sniper.

"There were no rocks being thrown or anything," Gaps said from his hospital bed. "I, was taking pictures of him, and then I saw him draw down and I knew he was going to shoot. The army said a soldier and a
