Marine's tattoos get him booted THE LAST GREAT out of boot camp

DAYTON, Ohio - When Marine Corps recruit Dylan Fogle showed up with a gargoyle and a thunderbird tattooed on his head, he got the boot from boot camp.

Fogle, 20, said the tattoos were visible through his hair when he signed up for a four-year hitch in November, and that his recruiter told him they wouldn't keep him out of the Marines.

Fogle, a Dayton resident, reported for basic training on Jan. 20 at Parris Island, S.C. For the next three weeks, he said, he performed in the top 10 percent of his platoon.

On Feb. 15, his commanding officer sent for him.

'He looked at my tattoos and said they were going to have to send me home," Fogle said Monday. "He said they didn't really fit the image of the Marine Corps because the Marines are always.

Maj. Scott Campbell,
spokesman for the base, said recruits can be discharged if they have a tattoo officials deem as offensive, obscene, or conveying a negative message about the mili-

The recruiter may have approved Fogle because his hair was longer at the time, Campbell

The gargoyle is on the back of Fogle's head; the mythical thunderbird over his left ear.

'Gargoyles, in architecture, were supposed to guard against evil, symbolically," Fogle said.


