al practice was to list soft drinks, beverages, catering, cups and the equivalent on the voucher to ensure that the voucher was paid, not clear how or when this national practice began.

According to the statement, the System has taken the following action in response to the indictments:
• Both the System and University have issued statements on the chase of alcohol and appropriate ceasing of vouchers.

• The A&M System Committee, working with the System Chief of Police Officers to inform all catering beverage vendors about the meaning of complete descriptions on invoices.
• System administrative and man resource personnel are working to implement training on voucher processing.

• The System Internal Audit department initiated a management control audit on the processing vouchers for the purchase of alcohol.

• The staff in the Office of General Counsel has conducted pre-meetings with vice presidents, department heads and system administrative and general office directors regarding legal issues that concern preparation of vouchers.

The indictments of Running Walters arose from an investigation conducted by the Texas Rangers. September after an anonymous letter was sent to Gov. Ann Richards charging several high-ranking officials with misconduct.

Richards forwarded the letter to the Rangers who have since been joined in the investigation by the attorney, said the indictments were not taken as a conclusion to the investigation, and both the FBI and Rangers anticipate further press releases will be made to the grand jury.
