Rep. Dan Rostenkowski, D-Ill, Ways and Means Committee da man, had urged Stark to leave the enue issues for the full committee hash out.

President Clinton, in a satellite dress to the California Medical Asso tion's House of Delegates in Anala Calif., urged doctors to "work with on the details and impress upon very large congressional delegation the time to act is now."

The doctors were introduced the president as "a group of p nervous California physicians," many of their questions showed asiness about whether the Cliff plan would limit doctors' and tients' choices in medical care.
