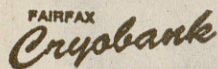

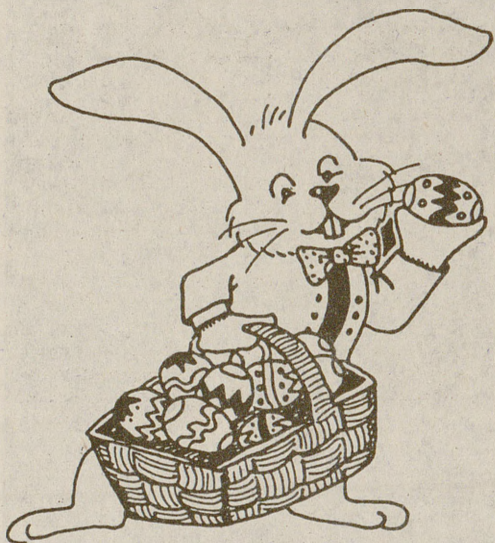

Oilers' Richardson throws for CFL team

Fomer A&M QB works out for Hamilton Tiger-Cats, plans Canada trip

HOUSTON — Houston Oilers quarterback Bucky Richardson worked out for the Canadian Football League Hamilton Tiger-Cats over the weekend and is planning a visit to Canada.

"They're going to get back to me this week," Richardson told the Houston Chronicle. "I've never been to Canada, and I'd like to visit the city and meet the people before I give them an answer."

Hamilton has offered Richardson, the Oilers' third-team quarterback behind Warren Moon and Cody Carlson, a two-year contract worth \$1 million. The Oilers have offered him a three-year deal that starts at \$250,000.

Richardson attended the Tiger-Cats' quarterback camp over the weekend in Phoenix.

"I threw about 30 balls, and they liked what they saw," he said. "They explained to me why they think I could be successful in the CFL. They

also like my running ability." The former Texas A&M star said he and agent Frank Bauer met with Hamilton's owner, coach, personnel director and offensive coordinator.

"Everything was great," he said. "We went out to dinner Saturday night and talked football ... They've followed my career, and they think I'd be ideal for their team."

The Oilers are also in danger of losing defensive ends Sean Jones and William Fuller and receiver Haywood Jeffries.

"We're just not hitting ball like we are capable."

The Aggies are capable of tremendous hitting output. The evidence lies in some of the numbers from the first third of the season.

Opening day, 17 runs on 10 hits against UT-Pan American.

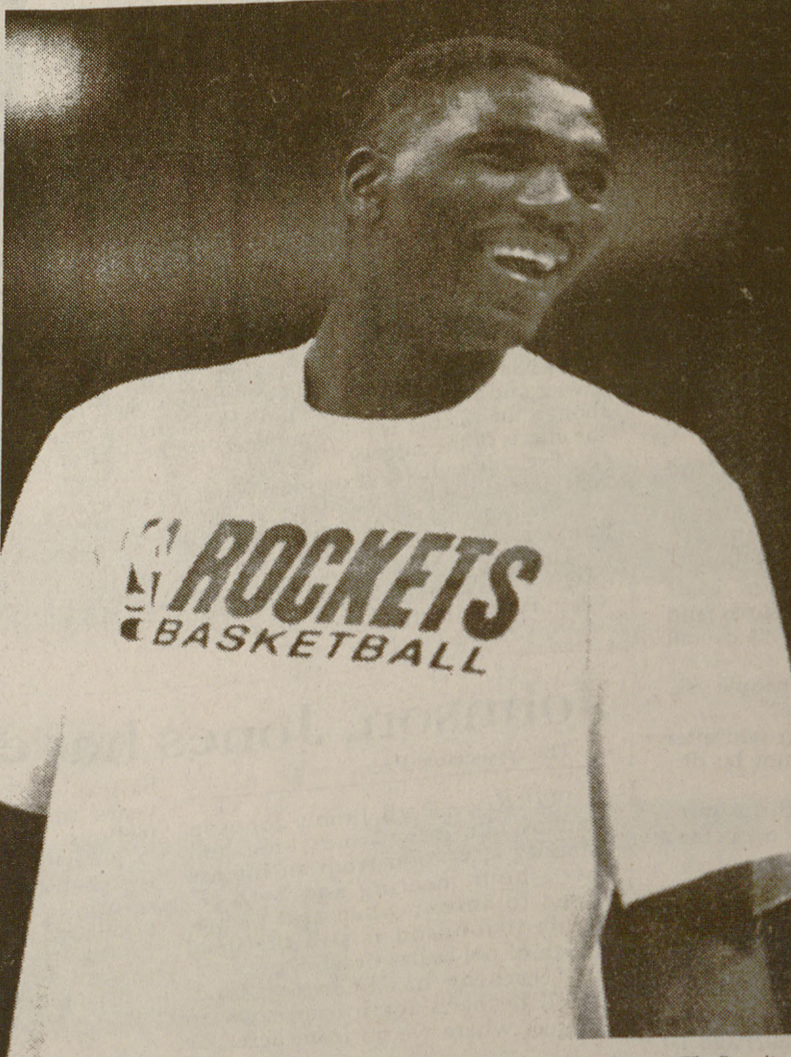
Feb. 15, 10 runs on 10 hits against Southeastern La. Feb. 16 runs on 19 hits followed days later by 14 runs on 18 hits both against Arizona.

March 10 runs on 12 hits against Texas A&M.

"I don't know whether the battle is against our opponent or ourselves," Johnson said.

"We have to show we have courage to come back from the corner. But, I've thought about the last couple of weeks."

joy this night." He liked the way the Lakers ambushed the Bucks from the start in one incredible half, an adrenaline rush from the opening jump to a 66-35 lead, and the way they responded to a fierce comeback in the second half.

The lapse in the middle, he knew, was from a lack of stamina and unfamiliarity with the new defense he installed.

"We wore them down," Johnson said, "but we wore ourselves down. The thing that caught up to us was fatigue. I'm so proud of the guys. To take one practice and change the whole defensive scheme, they weren't used to it.

They did an excellent job. Milwaukee came back like every professional team will. We have to keep up the pressure to the end."

He wants the Lakers so fit they can pressure teams on defense baseline to baseline, tipoff to buzzer. He figures the Lakers don't have the size and strength to win, so they must rely on quickness, endurance and intelligence. Smart shots, clever passes, keep legs and ball moving.

Johnson wants them running the way the Lakers did when he controlled the ball in Showtime. He could use a guy like himself on the roster. Controlling the tempo from the sideline isn't as easy as it is on the court, especially against better teams.

The Bucks are one of the worst teams, losers of eight straight on the road. Beating them by just nine points in a sold-out Forum and blowing most of a 36-point third-quarter lead do not inspire overconfidence. That means more boot camp for the Lakers, who remain six games behind Denver for the eighth and final Western Conference playoff spot with 15 games to go.

"If I can keep them believing in themselves and saying that is the way we can win and we ourselves into shape in terms of playing this style, we're gonna be fine," Johnson said. "This is what we play is tailor-made for this team because we create a lot of havoc and problems."

They created plenty of problems for the Bucks in the first half.

"It looked like the Lakers old," Milwaukee forward Ed Edwards said.

"They played a better first half than any team we've played a year long," Bucks coach Pat Dunleavy said. "I mean, nobody done that to us."

Nobody's made a coaching change like the Lakers this year bringing in someone of Johnson's stature and personality. He came in charged up, and that's how players reacted.

"I've been around him enough that I know when he's hyped up. And that was one of those times when he was really hyped up and ready to get this first one over his belt."
