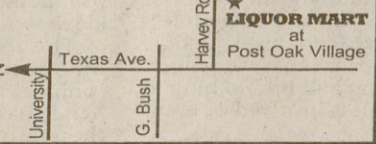

Rollins said. "Some of the best Aggies I know are not in the Corps."

The election commission confiscated the memo from a cadet with the names of all candidates except Hernandez and McGlothlin.

On one side of the memo, all non-Corps members are listed for the intent of "maintaining non-Corps leadership within the University."

Corps member Steve Kendrick is listed on this side above the name "Benedict Arnold." Both Hernandez and McGlothlin believe that the Arnold remark is also directed at them.

Kendrick said he has openly supported Ashby.

Haraway said he did not know Kendrick and referred to the inclusion of Benedict Arnold as "an attempt to make a smart-aleck remark."

"I can say whatever the hell I want because I know I'm within the bounds of the law," Haraway said. "That was a closed memo meant for Corps members only. It's none of (the election commission's) damn business what it means."

"The Corps will take care of the Corps."

The other side of the memo lists

all Corps members running for elections "for maintaining Corps leadership within the University" and instructs the cadets to bring an ID and the sheet to polling places.

Possession of unregistered election materials within 30 feet of a polling place is a violation of A&M election rules.

Hernandez said he was disappointed that Haraway signed the memo.

"It's a shame Will Haraway has the power to influence people and damage the integrity of the Corps and Texas A&M in the process," Hernandez said.

Haraway said he failed to see how the omission of two names could be damaging to the election process and was not a "hate campaign or conspiracy."

"I think having Ross and Ray in the Corps is damaging enough," Haraway said. "I think they're the ones who are damaging the integrity of the Corps."

Ferguson said the commission decided to issue a \$25 fine to everyone on the list because they could not determine who instigated it.

She said many irate candidates had phoned the student government office upon learning of their fines.

Rob Holland, an off-campus senator candidate, said he was furious his name had been put on the list

without his permission.

"I think the Corps is contradicting themselves," Holland said. "They shot themselves in the foot with this. It was terribly dishonest."

David Hall, interim Judicial Board chairman, said candidates can appeal the fines to the Judicial Board. Hall said that as of Wednesday afternoon, he received six appeal notices and expected more.

Hall said the Judicial Board would meet Monday to discuss the appeals.

If an appeal is filed after the election, the Judicial Board will rule on the validity of the elections and could reverse election results, Hall said.

Last year, the Judicial Board overturned a decision by the election commission to fine Corps members for circulating a list endorsing Corps members.

The board ruled the list was not campaign material but rather an organizational endorsement.

Election Commissioner Michael Crain said he deemed this year's list as campaign material because it did not endorse all the members of the Corps as an organization.

"Had they included everyone's name, then it would have been an endorsement," Crain said. "But since they left two off, it was campaigning for specific people."

Crain said he had discussed the

memo with Haraway before the election and told him the memo would be confiscated if anyone brought the polling place. Crain said the memo was seen by several Corps members and that the memo was not distributed.

"I defined possession as a body, in a folder, anywhere seen," Crain said. "The guidelines also say that any material brought to a polling place of that voter while within the polling place and any other place where the material would be used for campaigning."

Haraway said it was his understanding that cadets could bring the memo to polling sites as long as the memo was not distributed.

"I can't exercise control over a Corps member," Haraway said.

He compared the memo to the Battalion's election guide.

"It's just a list," Haraway said. "They can fine me and I'll do it, but it is self-defeating to do nothing more than to vote straight Republican or Democrat because you agree with party's platform."

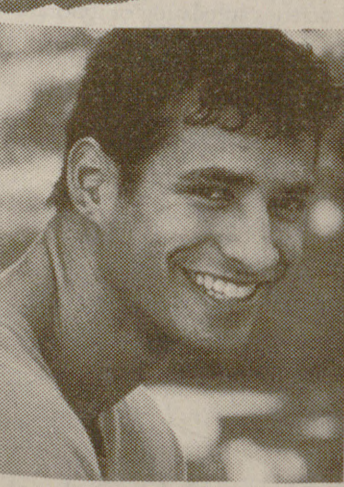

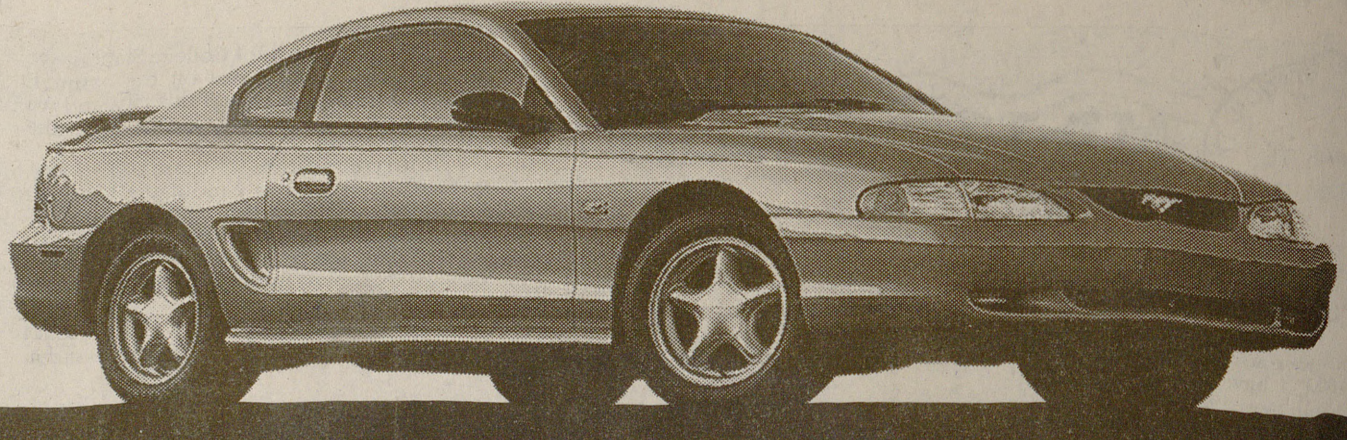
