In regard to the now famous "Bear Arnold" memo, Article IV, Section IV of election regulations states, "items passed by the candidates that are not classific campaign literature will be termed parap Ge nalia and must be approved by the Eer Commission." The memorandum was dist uted by Corps Staff and not a candid Therefore the memo is not paraphernalia defined by the election regulations.

Article IV, Section IV also states that all a paign literature and paraphernalia must be" with the Election Commission prior to its dis ution or display." Interestingly enough, a paign literature" is never defined in the Eo Regulations. The memorandum, however, determined "campaign literature" by the Eo Commission and fines were issued. These fin later dropped - were issued prior to a lud Board hearing. Albeit this is the procedure forth in the Election Regulations, it is a direct lation of a students' right to due process as gr ed by Article V of the University Regulations.

The entire episode has uncovered two facts. One, the Élection Commission need recast its vague and often contradictory E tion Regulations. Two, The Battalion need contain its blatant disregard for the truth defamatory opinions. If anyone is "com ing" students, it is The Battalion and its pr ed words, not those of Corps Comman Haraway.


