Serbian troops pierce unprotected 'safe zone'

U.S. makes no plans to intervene

SARAJEVO, Bosnia-Herzegovina — Hundreds of civilians fled burning villages Tuesday ahead of Bosnian Serb troops who breached defense lines around the Muslim enclave of Gorazde.

An officer in the Muslim-dominated Bosnian government said the enclave's defenders had been forced back by the breakthroughs. Government officials called the situation critical for the besieged eastern area, which was declared a U.N. "safe zone" last May but has been unprotected by U.N. troops.

Serb leaders and international aid workers also reported Serb advances after a week of heavy fighting. U.N. aid workers said 52 civilians had been killed and 249 wounded since last week.

There was no sign Western nations would intervene as NATO did with threats of air strikes to force the withdrawal of Serb artillery around Sarajevo. The United States said it had no plans to help Gorazde's 65,000 residents.

Gen. John Shalikashvili, chairman of the U.S. Joint Chiefs of Staff, told reporters in Washington that air power would be ineffective against what is primarily small-arms fighting around Gorazde.

He said that should not be seen as a "green light" for Serb attacks, and he did not flatly rule out intervention. "Tomorrow, the circumstances in Gorazde could very well change and the use of air power could be very appropriate," he said.

U.S. Gen. Sir Michael Rose, the U.N. commander in Bosnia, planned to go to Gorazde to assess the situation Wednesday. About 200 refugees from the area blocked the entrance to his Sarajevo headquarters Tuesday, demanding immediate action to save Gorazde, which is

about 30 miles southeast of Sarajevo.

"Please inform Gen. Rose tomorrow is too late," said Marsala, one of the protesters.

The enclave has been under siege during much of the 2-year war, began when Bosnia's government declared independence from the dominated Yugoslavia.

"Our units have defeated government forces inside Gorazde and have reached the bank of the Drina River," Manojlo Milovanovic, the Bosnian Serb's chief of staff, told the Bosnian Serb news agency SRNA.

The Drina River divides the enclave, which is about nine miles from east to west and 12 miles north to south. The town of Gorazde is on the left bank of the Drina.

A government army spokesman speaking on condition of anonymity, said Serb troops broke through defense lines at three locations. Government soldiers had retreated toward the center of Gorazde, he said.

Commanders in Gorazde, U.N. military observers the Serbs broke defense lines to the southeast and were very close to town, said Maj. Rob Annink, a spokesman in Sarajevo. The military observers were not trained about the enclave for security reasons.

The international humanitarian group Doctors Without Borders, which has two physicians in Gorazde, said Serb troops had "effectively pierced" front lines to the north and east of the enclave.

"Many villages on the left bank of the river Drina have been over-run and burnt as part of the offensive. As a result, hundreds of refugees are fleeing," the group said in a statement.

Black high school students protest reinstatement of white principal

WEDOWEE, Ala. — Dozens of black students boycotted classes Monday to protest the reinstatement of a white principal who threatened to cancel the high school prom if blacks and whites dated each other.

Joining the boycott was student ReVonda Bowen, who filed a civil rights lawsuit against Principal Huldon Humphries for allegedly telling her she was "a mistake" because her father is white and her mother is black.

The boycott was launched by civil rights groups as the 680-student Randolph County High School, which is about 38 percent black, reopened after a week-long spring break.

Humphries returned after being suspended March 14. The school board voted 4-2 on Thursday to reinstate him. One white member resigned in protest.

Humphries, 55, who has been principal for 25 years, declined comment, but told one newspaper reporter, "I'd like for you to leave

town."

At a Feb. 24 assembly, he said mixed-race couples would not be allowed at the prom and that it would be canceled if they showed up. Humphries withdrew the threat the next day and has said his comments were misunderstood.

Bowen said Humphries told her she was "a mistake" when she asked whom she should take to the prom.

The 16-year-old junior said Monday that her lawyer advised her not to talk about Humphries, but that she would return to school Tuesday.

At least 60 black students stayed the day at two churches discussing multicultural issues and nonviolence protest.

Many of the boycotting students wore black-and-white ribbons.

Charlotte Clark-Frieson, a lone black on the school board, a leader of the boycott, said she made the ribbons "as a symbol of our movement, a symbol of our belief in one nation under God."
