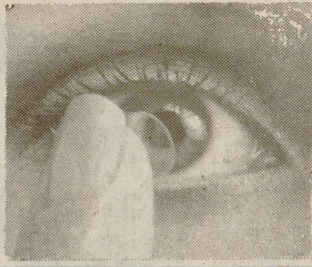

REINCARNATED BILLY GOAT RETURNS TO B-C

Hey kids! Guess who's coming to town — it's Billy Goat!
Fresh off an East Coast tour and boasting of a new live album, the p-funk band-o-fun will take to the familiar stage at the Stafford Opera House Saturday night.

Some older goat may be a bit reluctant to drive downtown and pay about \$7 to see a band that has a higher turnover rate than the Dallas Mavericks coaching staff. So maybe the following material will help them decide.

Question: Who is Billy Goat now?
According to Zac Baird, Billy Goat's keyboardist, this incarnation of the band is the best offspring of the ever-evolving tribal lifeblood.

"This is the Billy Goat now and we are on a very cool trip," he said. "Everyone remembers a particular version of Billy Goat. But all of the former members left on their own because they had other things they wanted to do. Maybe people expect to see a certain version of the band but this version of Billy Goat is kicking ass."

Question: Who are the members?
Billy Goat still has two of the founding members — the notorious lyricist Mike Dillon remains on percussion and vocals, and the goddess of props, Kim Pruitt, carries on with dance and an increased vocal role. The rest of the lineup is Baird, formerly with Whitey, Steve Roehm on drums, Syd Madden on guitar and

Question: Where has the Native Texas band been?

Baird said this version of Billy Goat has relocated to Lawrence, Kan.
"We are still involved with the Texas scene,"

he said. "We still care about Texas but we're concentrating on playing nationally now. We did 200 shows last year. Most bands do that, but we are getting real popular in other places. You wouldn't think of Billy Goat in DeMoines, Iowa, but we are the biggest there right now."

"We like playing in Texas but it has been hard to get people to respond there. How they will react to our new sound."

Question: What is the band's new sound?
Baird said the band still performs a lot of material off Bush Roaming Mammals but has written a good deal of new material.

"We have our own thing going," he said. "People are really getting into it. Right now we have this kind of Miles Davis jazz sound."

Baird added that their sound is really a mix of funk, rap, ska and rock.

"We have been working with Karl from the Brave Combo on some new stuff," he said.

Question: Now what is this new live album?
Baird said the new album consists of 17 tracks. Of the 17, 14 are previously unreleased songs, two are old tunes, "F---K More Less" and "Chef," and one track is a collaboration with Kim. The album was recorded at a Lawrence, Kan. studio.

Billy Goat is now going on its fifth tour. There have been at least 40 people in the band over the years and every combination of the band has enjoyed a good deal of success. Maybe this one will, too.

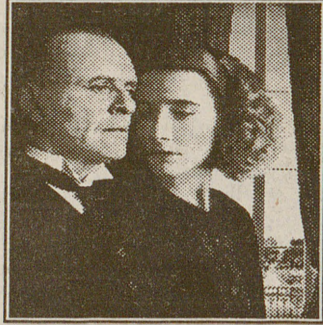
