Dodgers' Strawberry suffers sting of substance abuse

LOS ANGELES — Darryl Strawberry's lawyer says the troubled Los Angeles Dodgers outfielder was abusing drugs and alcohol for a "substantial period of time" before admitting he had a problem.

Bob Shapiro also said Wednesday he thinks Strawberry "bottomed out" on Sunday when he disappeared and failed to show up for an exhibition game.

Strawberry returned to Los Angeles from New York on Wednesday after meeting with one doctor representing the players' union and another representing the owners to determine a course of treatment for his drinking and drug use. Shapiro said Strawberry was accompanied to New York by his wife.

Shapiro said he believes Strawberry will en-ter an undisclosed clinic by Friday at the latest. "He's headed back here awaiting the doc-

tors' recommendation regarding the proper drug treatment facility," Shapiro said. "The doctors have concluded he has a substance abuse problem and is amenable to treatment.

"The doctors will recommend the appro-priate treatment facility and Darryl will be admitted immediately, as soon as we find out

what the facility is."' Strawberry, 32, was treated for alcohol problems in 1990.

When asked how long Strawberry had been using drugs and alcohol, Shapiro said:


