Bats find new home in S.A. high school

SAN ANTONIO — About 50 Mexican free-tail bats made themselves at home in a wing of Roosevelt High School on Monday, so about 700 students moved out.

Many of the unwanted hangers-on were clustered in twos and threes on the ceiling. Others were napping in the upper corners of a stairwell.

The invaded wing will remain closed until all the bats have been evicted. The students moved to the auditorium and cafeteria to hold classes.

Tim Hanko, owner of Commercial Bat Control, told the school that releasing the bats is preferable to killing them since their bodies would create an offensive odor and pose a possible health hazard.

"They're basically very harmless," he said. "Otherwise, I wouldn't be in this business. I've been bitten several times, but the bats have been very small teeth."

Custodians removed most of the bats, including a few dead ones.

Just one person was injured during the bat infestation. Journalism teacher and debate coach David Laird, 49, was bitten or scratched on the right index finger. As a precautionary measure, he will undergo a series of rabies vaccinations.

"I got here this morning and the custodians were trying to get bats out of the hallways and room," Laird said. "About 8:45 a.m., I turned on the lights in the darkroom and was bitten or nicked or scratched or whatever by a bat."

"It flew up and got away when I tried to get it off."

Dr. Catherine Tull, Region 8 veterinarian for the Texas Department of Health in Uvalde, said Mexican free-tail bats are not aggressive, but people should leave them alone and not make contact with them.

longed to a racist club, while Fisher ad said Mattox told him.

On one issue they disagreed. Mattox said he supported a single-payer health care reform while Fisher said he didn't.

Fisher refused to align himself with any of the different proposals in Congress.

But major issues got little attention.

Instead the race focused on country club membership, purchase of a building, a check to the Bush-Quayle campaign, troops on the border.

Mattox called on Fisher to resign from the all-white Dea Country Club. Fisher refused, saying to do so would be hypocritical.

Mattox depicted Fisher as a publican in disguise for money to Republican candidates. In campaign appearances, Mattox frequently displayed a blown-up copy of Fisher's \$1,000 check to the Bush-Quayle campaign.

But Fisher says he asked for a refund, and then his wife contributed \$1,000 to the GOP White House ticket. Fisher said he made contributions to other Republicans, such as conservative U.S. Sen. Richard Lugar of Indiana, because of friendships.

Mattox also accused Fisher of trying to buy the election. In Jan. 1, Fisher had reported pumping about \$1.4 million of his own money into the campaign. During that period, Fisher had outspent Mattox more than 2-to-1, — \$1.6 million to \$714,627.

Fisher defended his campaign expenditures, and criticized Mattox for taking money from political action committees.

Fisher attacked Mattox for purchase of a 10-story office building in Austin.

The Texas Department of Insurance says that Mattox's insurance company partners exceeded the amount of money they could contribute toward the purchase. Mattox said the problem is between the insurance Department and his partners and has nothing to do with him.
