Thomas Darling, Corps commandant, said no punishment is being pursued at this time against the three cadets who were caught scratching off names.

He said the issue is currently in the hands of Haraway and James McCleskey, chief of operations and training who is in charge of the Corps Honor Board.

Darling said their guilt is still to be determined. "If the charges are substantiated, then some action should be taken," he said.
