

Dallas Stars sweep Blues in first round

ST. LOUIS Modano scored both Dallas goals, including the gamewinner on a power play with 3:49 to play, as the Stars completed a four-game sweep of the St. Louis Blues with a 2-1 victory Sunday.

Modano took a pass from Russ Courtnall and scored his fifth goal of the playoffs from the right circle.

It was the third time in four games that Dallas put away the Blues late. The Stars scored twice in the final 3:49 to win Game 1, 5-3, and got a rare overtime power-play goal from Paul Cavallini to take Game 3.




