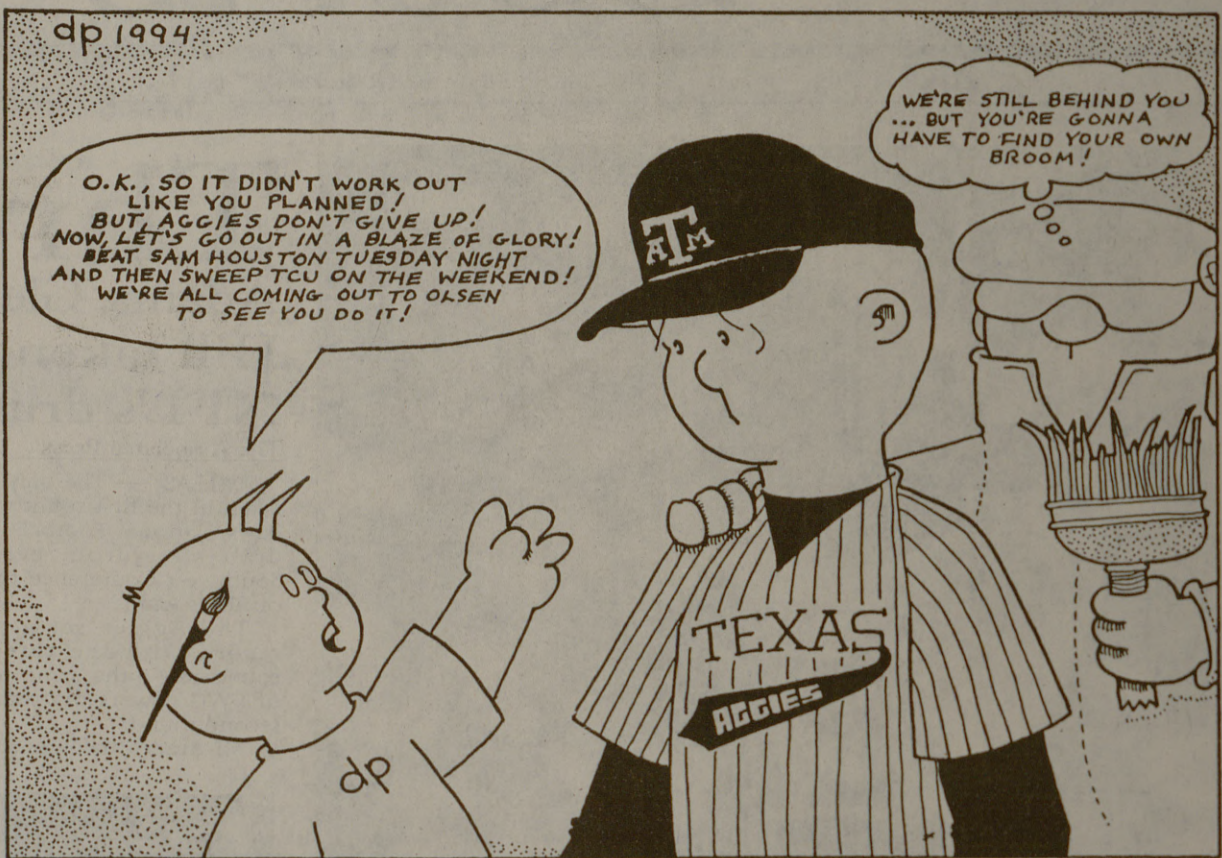

Dallas Stars sweep Blues in first round

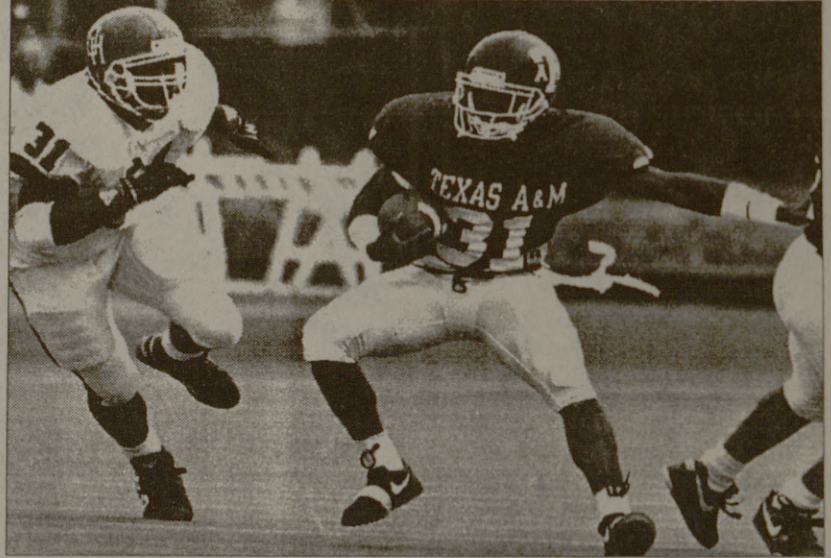
ST. LOUIS — Mike Modano scored two Dallas goals, including the game-winner on a power play with 3:49 to play, as the Stars completed a four-game sweep of the St. Louis Blues with a 2-1 victory Sunday.

Modano took a pass from Russ Courtnall and scored his fifth goal of the playoffs from the right circle.

It was the third time in four games that Dallas put away the Blues late. The Stars scored twice in the final 3:49 to win Game 1, 5-3, and got a rare overtime power-play goal from Paul Cavallini to take Game 3.

Stars goaltender Darcy Wakaluk had his fourth consecutive strong game. Wakaluk stopped 25 shots and is 11-1-3 in his last 15 starts.

But Wakaluk needed a break to close it out. The Blues jammed the net in the final seconds and a St. Louis player apparently nudged the puck over the goal line with 6.4 seconds left as the goal light went on. But referee Dan Marouelli ruled he had already whistled the play dead and called for a faceoff, adding 1.1 seconds to the clock.

...uation," said Aggies coach R.C. Slocum. "Their running back situation is thin."

Rice's Bert Emanuel was the first non-Aggie to be drafted, going to Atlanta in the second round with the 45th pick of the draft.

Emanuel, a quarterback at Rice who recently converted to receiver, should see plenty of playing time. Receiver Michael Haynes left as a free agent and Mike Pritchard was traded to Denver.

Emanuel also may even see time at quarterback in an option-type offense for 2-point conversions.

Houston linebacker Allen Aldridge went to Denver as the 51st pick, and expects to help the Broncos' often porous defense.

Aldridge, 6-foot-1 and 245 pounds, started at defensive end in 1991 and 1992, but switched to strongside linebacker last season.

Texas defensive back Van Malone was the first Longhorn drafted, going to Detroit with the 57th pick. Malone, who blocked six kicks in college, should see immediate action on special teams.

De La Garza also had success when his men in the javelin placed first, second and sixth.

Senior Ty Sevin became the first American-born thrower to win the SWC meet since 1981.

Sevin tossed another automatic qualifying throw of 241'-05" to win the competition.

Freshman Carlos Pantin also qualified for the national meet to be held in Boise, ID on June 1 through 4. Pantin threw 224'-1", and Sophomore Fernando Palamo placed third with a toss of 198'-3".

Sophomore Curt Young continued his steady progression toward greatness in the 400-meter hurdles. Young automatically qualified for the NCAA meet with a time of 50.35.

"I'm satisfied with the personal best and automatic qualification," Young exclaimed.

Freshman Larry Wade continued the Aggies hurdling crew when he placed third in the men's 110-hurdles.

Wade, who fought off a jury and one of the strongest fields in the nation, ran 14.88.

"He was determined to represent A&M and the hurdling crew with a lot of heart," handle and jump coach Al Brown said.

The Aggies had many other big efforts in the championship meet.

Sophomore Tim Bryan jumped 24'-3.75" to finish second for the second straight year.

Kendrick Smith, a sophomore triple and long jumper, placed fourth in the long jump and fifth in the men's triple jump with a career-best triple jump 50'-7.5".

Seniors Ted Reynolds and Larry Taylor placed third and fourth in the men's shot put. Taylor also had a fourth-place finish in the discus.

Senior Ross Stooksberry used an incredible kick to reach sixth place in the men's 10,000-meters and came back the next day to take fourth in the 5,000 meters.

The 4X400 relay team of Stacy Zamzow, Mike Miller, Danny McCray and Curt Young provisionally qualified for the NCAA meet.

The time of 3:06.68 marked the best time of the season for the indoor national champions. Dante Bolden was forced to miss the race due to an injury to his that occurred in the men's 200 meters race.
