ings and instincts," he said. "Pay attention to behavior that's not right, and never be ashamed to assert yourself and say no."

He said many times women feel ashamed or embarrassed to say no.

"Women don't always identify a date as rape," Kretzschmar said. "They feel guilty and betrayed, but don't want mom and dad to know."

A&M has many support organizations for sexual assault victims.

Theis-Cole said there is 24-hour assistance available for victims.

"First they are taken to the hospital for treatment, and if they wish to go through student conflict resolution, our staff would be there to assist them," she said.

Kretzschmar said students should take advantage of the rape crisis center, student affairs and student counseling when confronted with a problem.

"The student counseling services are excel-

lent and are here specifically to help students," he said.

Kretzschmar said self-defense classes also can be beneficial.

"Self-defense classes make females more aware of what is going on around them," Kretzschmar said. "If something were to happen, they would be more apt to have a plan and respond."

The department of student affairs encourages students to take advantage of campus escort services rather than walk alone at night.
