Inmates flood jail to protest overcrowding

KERRVILLE — Inmates unhappy about crowded conditions clogged toilets and drains, flooding the Kerr County Jail, Sheriff Frank Kaiser says.

About one-third of the facility was left flooded by the late-night disturbance on Tuesday, she said. There were no injuries and no significant damage.

"We have double the amount of inmates we should have in some cells," she said. About 90 inmates have been housed in the 63-bed jail for the past two weeks.

Seven inmates identified as the troublemakers will be placed on administrative segregation, the sheriff said.

Kerr County Judge William G. Stacy said that he saw a list of about 15 grievances by inmates, including a demand for more visitation rights, quicker trials and the right to smoke inside the jail.

Smoking was banned at the jail several months ago under the direction of the Texas Jail Standards Commission.

The commission, which has granted the county a waiver allowing the population to reach 67 inmates, is aware of the crowded conditions and was notified of Tuesday's incident, the sheriff said.

"They have said to keep their posted," Kaiser said.

Because jails are crowded throughout the state, the county has been able to farm out only about 30 inmates to other counties, she said. Most of those are held at Coryell County Jail in Gatesville.

"The more time that passes, the less optimistic we are," she said.

The sad thing about a case like this, Wanda said, is that even if the person is found, it is not very likely he will spend much time in jail.

Julie is currently considering

the possibility of returning to school, but Wanda said they are still looking at other options.

"Julie would like to return to A&M, but with the situation still unresolved, we are not really comfortable with that idea," she said.

Julie is preparing applications for other schools outside the state of Texas, but Wanda said they are being very particular about where she might go.

She said officials at Texas A&M have been very helpful in cooper-

ating with the particulars involved with transferring, and they are being very careful in helping to assure that Julie cannot be found.

Wanda said although Kevin's actions have had terrible effects on Julie and all of the Dalton family, the case has actually pulled the family closer together.

"For the most part, I think it has given us a new appreciation of our family," she said. "It has renewed our faith."

The University Police Department and the College Station Po-

lice Department are still looking for leads in the Julie Dalton case and are encouraging anyone who has any information in the case to come forward.

According to stalking laws in the state of Texas, stalking on the first occasion is a Class B misdemeanor. If it happens on more than one occasion, the charge becomes a Class A misdemeanor. If the case turns into assault, the crime is considered a third-degree felony.

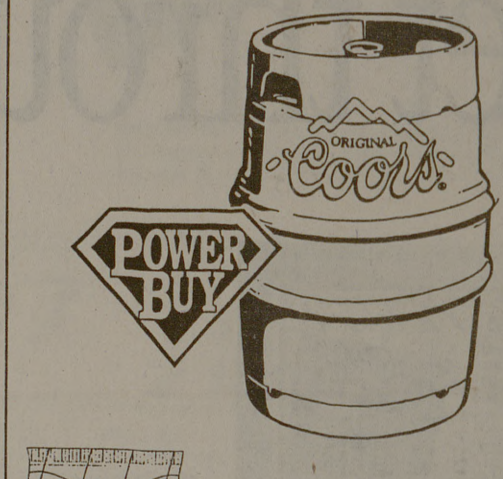
