Midwife convicted of injury to child

WACO — A McLennan County jury convicted midwife Julia Pirie on Wednesday of injury to a child, concluding that she acted recklessly in not seeking prompt medical treatment for a baby she helped deliver.

The jury deliberated about 13 hours before determining that Pirie was reckless in the death of Hillary Watson.

The baby died in December 1992 after contracting an infection.

Doctors testified that the infant was infected because Pirie did not deliver her until 35 hours after her mother's water broke.

Prosecutors and defense attorneys later worked out a settlement, under which Judge George Allen sentenced Pirie to four years probation and ordered her not to practice midwifery during that time.

Pirie, who has delivered at least four other babies

who have died in the past year, also had to surrender her midwife registration with the Texas Department of Health.

Pirie, 36, of Lott agreed not to appeal her third-degree felony conviction.

Prosecutors agreed not to pursue other potential charges.

"Our goal was for her to stop being reckless," prosecutor Susan Kelly said.

"I had never intended for this woman to go behind bars," she said.

"This was a guilt case, and we would have asked the jury to give her probation."

Many of Pirie's supporters cried and hugged each other outside the courtroom after the verdict.

They said several pregnant women were upset because they were counting on Pirie to deliver their babies.

Pirie wouldn't comment after the trial.


