






But their names aren't Nolan Ryan.

You're going to get ex-cited to hear that Nolan Ryan is throwing fastballs in the 90s again. That's on his own mental

radar gun, of course, but it always has been pretty accurate.

Nolan always had a de-cent idea what his body could and couldn't do.

The first inclination is to tell him to report immedi-ately to The Ballpark in Arlington.

Kevin Kennedy, Claude Osteen and the Rangers need you, Nolan.

They need pitching so badly, Kennedy has been looking at Osteen's left-handed batting practice of-ferings with the eye of a starving man on a deserted island.

Desperate isn't the word for it.

But let's not be selfish. Ryan is right where he wants to be and where he should be.

He was sitting as unobtrusively as a world-renowned figure could sit on the TCU bench last weekend in College Station as the Frogs wrapped up their first outright South-west Conference title in almost four decades.
