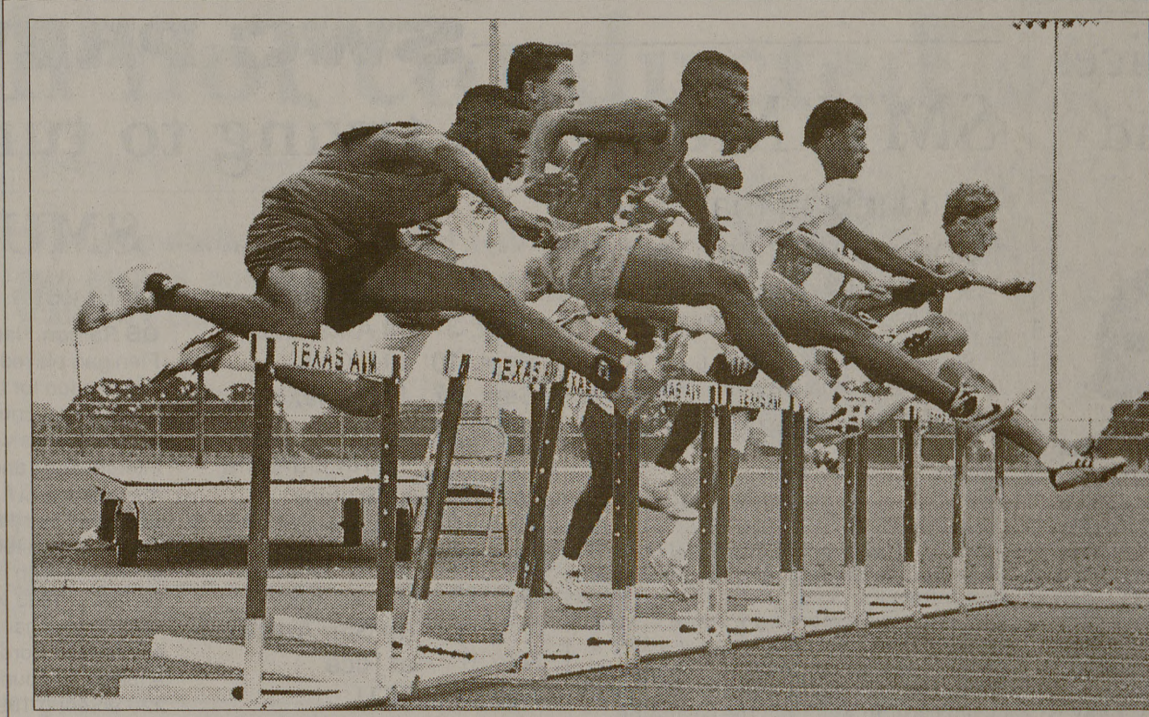

SWC PREVIEW

New coach Hatfield thinks Owls will fly high

Says SWC title 'up for grabs'

Rice University, under the direction of new coach Ken Hatfield, is going for their third straight winning season in 1994. Hatfield is no stranger to the Southwest Conference. Before a three-year stint at Clemson, Hatfield was the coach at Arkansas, where he compiled a 55-17-1 record, including two trips to the Cotton Bowl. With Texas A&M ineligible for post-season, Hatfield said Rice fans should look forward to not just a winning season, but a possible Southwest Conference championship.

"With Texas A&M not eligible but our game with them still counting, I think it's up for grabs," Hatfield said. "Anybody could win the championship and we have as good a chance as anybody."

"We want to be in the Cotton Bowl," he said. Leading Rice's offense in 1994 will be quarterback John LaRocca and Yoncy Edmonds, Rice's returning rushing leader. LaRocca inherits the Rice offense from Bert Emanuel, who many called the best all-around athlete ever at Rice. LaRocca will be called on to guide a new offense at Rice, the spread option.

It is an offense designed to utilize LaRocca's strong arm, Rice's talented receivers and Hatfield's past success of guiding rushing offenses.

Hatfield said the quarterback will be a key in the new offense. "Everything revolves around the quart back and how effective he can be," Hatfield said. "Josh had a great spring and he feels very confident in what he can do."

Leading Rice's rushing game is Yoncy Edmonds. Edmonds ran for 931 yards last year despite being injured the last two games. Edmonds expects to get his number called often in Rice's one-back set.

Protection up front for LaRocca could be a questionable area for Rice, as only two starters return on the offensive line, Chris Cooley, an all-American candidate, and Bobby Gray.

RB Yoncy Edmonds: Edmonds was a second team All-SWC selection after compiling 941 yards on 199 carries in 1993, despite missing the last two games of the season with an injury.

QB Josh LaRocca: LaRocca has to try and make the Owls fans forget Bert Emanuel. LaRocca has some starting experience and has career stats of 106 completions in 202 attempts with 10 touchdowns and 1,260 yards passing.

ILB Emmett Waldron: Waldron has started 25 straight games for the Owls and has been their tackling leader for the past two seasons, nabbing 103 tackles in 1993. 67 of those were unassisted.

Players to watch

The small size of the defensive line won't be a problem for the Owls, Hatfield said. "We don't have the great size along the defensive line, but we will make up for it by just running hard to the football," Hatfield said.

Whether Hatfield will take Rice to the next level is still a question. He believes he can and he has his players believe it. "Most of me is with other students who look on time, whether they're here or not. I just want to be the best in America," he said.

Flanigan will be passing to an experienced group of receivers. Five of the returning receivers had career highs in receptions during 1993. The receivers are led by senior Mick Rossley who had a team high 46 receptions last season. "This will be the kind of year we looked for when our receivers were young," Rossley said. "They are experience veterans now. The key is keeping them healthy."

In order to keep the Mustangs' run-and-shoot offense going, Rossley will rely on an experienced offensive line. Only one starter was lost from a squad that helped SMU more than double its rushing average (60.2 yards per game in 1992 to 137.1 in 1993) and reduce quarterback sacks by 21.

The area hardest hit by graduation for the Mustangs is the defensive line. All three starters are gone. They included second team All-SWC ends Chad Patton and Adam Voyles and DT Byron
