Gary Engelgau, executive di-rector of A&M's admissions and records, said the error is regretted by the University.

"We set up systems, and sys-tems don't always work as planned," Engelgau said. "The numbers sent to the magazine were overlooked, and I apologize for the mistake.

Rene Henry, executive director of University relations, said a letter to Money Magazine's editor was mailed Monday, notifying them of the error.

"It will take a few weeks before we hear a response from the magazine," Henry said. "A&M

ings. "We also want to see if other factors lowered A&M's ratings as well," he said.

Henry said he was surprised when he saw A&M was not on the list because the University's tuition and fees are comparable to those of the University of Texas in Austin, which ranked 13th on the list.

"Since we are both state schools, our monetary fees should be similar," he said. "I would have expected us to be un-der Texas's 13th ranking or at least close.

Rachel Campbell, a senior pe-troleum engineering major, said A&M's drop in the ratings does

"A&M being off the chart on Money Magazine's top 100 col-

lege bargains really surprised me," Campbell said. "What was so surprising was the amount A&M dropped — from 42 to past

"I don't think it will have a large effect on A&M, though, be-cause of its prestige as a University," she said

Éight Texas colleges did make the list. Rice University was ranked No. 2 for the second year in a row, followed by the University of Texas in Austin at 13th place, Trinity University at 24th place and Baylor University was ranked 34th place.

Austin College in Sherman ranked 47th, Southwestern University 56th, St. Mary's University of San Antonio ranked 77th, and the University of Dallas at 99th place.

According to Money Magazine, the best education for the dollar can be found at New Col-

lege of the University of South Houston's Rice University was

at second place; Trenton State College in New Jersey at third; the State University of New York in Binghamton at fourth and Northeast Missouri State

University at fifth place. Money Magazine's rankings will be released in a special edi tion of the magazine which will hit the newsstands Sept. 6.

The rankings are based on factors such as entrance exam results, graduation rates, facult resources and deployment, bud gets for instruction and student services and default rations or graduates' student loans. The figures are then compared with each college's tuition and fees.

The rankings are a reflection of the monetary value of the school, not the academic educa tion the students receive.


