

# Whistleblowers sue S&L cleanup agency alleging harassment

WASHINGTON (AP) Four Resolution Trust Corn employees, including a Da las lawyer, have sued the agency for \$2 million, alleg ing it engaged in a pattern of retaliation against them for trying to expose waste, fraud and abuse.

Other plaintiffs are two attorneys from the RTC's Denver office and an asse manager in Valley Forge,

Dallas attorney Juan Luis Burgos-Gandia is on admir istrative leave while agend officials review their dec sion to fire him. Burgos Gandia contends the RTO retaliated against him when he tried to alert officials to the fact that a law firm was over-billing the government by charging \$1,000 an hour for S&L cleanup work.

Others are contemplating joining the lawsuit, include ing L. Jean Lewis, the Kansas City investigator who prepared criminal refer rals on a failed Arkansas savings and loan that mentioned President Clinton.

"I have talked to the Gov ernment Accountability Pro ject, and we are giving con sideration to joining the lawsuit," said Michael For shey, Lewis' attorney. "V have not made a final dec

sion yet."
"Ultimately, we antic pate having as many as I people in this suit," said Jei Ruch, executive director of the Government Account ability Project, a whistle

blower protection group.

The lawsuit, filed Thursday in U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia alleges that the RTC syten atically has targeted for retaliation employees who have testified before Congress, cooperated with General Accounting Office probes, or tried to alerthe agency's inspector general misconduct, waste, fraud and abuse.

The suit seeks an imme diate injunction to end fur ther harassment, and asks that personnel records be corrected, back pay issued and the plaintiffs reinstated to their former posts. It also requests a court hearing within 20 days.

The lawsuit is another public relations debacle for the S&L cleanup agency which has been under in scrutiny in rece months for leaks involving the investigation of Madison Guaranty Savings & Loan Association — the Arkansa thrift at the center of the Whitewater affair - and other matters.

"We're aware of the lawsuit, but we have not seen it and we cannot comm specifically," said RTC spokeswoman

Neuringer.
"This is like a RICO suit except with the RTC, that stands for Retaliation-Influenced Corrupt Organiza-tion," said Bruce Pederson, a senior RTC attorney in Den ver who has twice testified about agency problems before the Senate Banking Committee. "It's a bureaucratic Mafia."

RICO, the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organization Act, was originally intended as a legal weapon against mobsters and has been used by prosecutors in a number of financial cases in recent years.

Within the past year, documents obtained by The Associated Press show high-ranking RTC officials in Washington authorized a search of Pederson's office computer — a move he alleges violated his privacy rights.

Another plaintiff, Denver attorney Jacqueline Taylor, has been stripped of her man agement duties and ordered by the agency's top attorney not to talk to news reporters

about agency issues. Richard Dunn, the asset manager, alleges that after he reported overcharges by independent contractors working for the agency, he was fired and placed under surveillance by detectives hired by the RTC.
