"There needs to be several points of view because education is not just what you get out of books, but what you get from your peers, from discussions in the classroom and in social settings and from being a member of society."

Englegau said A&M encourages diversity and works at increasing the minority population.

"A portion of admission is based on grades alone," Englegau said. "But we do reserve the right to look at other attributes, such as accomplishments, in an effort to increase diversity."

"We are under mandate to assure diversity and fairness," he said.

Jacobson said affirmative action is modeled after an old system intended to get veterans back into the workplace after they returned from war.

"Men who went off to war were out of the civilian world for a while, and those who didn't gained valuable work experience and knowledge," Jacobson said.

"When the men returned from war, they had a more difficult

time finding jobs because others had advantages over them.

"This started a system that allowed veterans to get extra points on such things as placement tests," he said.

Jacobson said the black and Hispanic community had experienced similar difficulties in competing for jobs.

"The minority culture has been let down," Jacobson said. "Because of missed opportunities, many of them have grown up with the knowledge that they are oppressed."

"Minorities need to know there is an open door," he said.

Jacobson said affirmative action was designed to decrease discrimination. As in the case of four white University of Texas law students, some might say it promotes reverse discrimination.

But, Jacobson said, some form of discrimination will always be present.

"Look at how school admissions have always been done," he said. "Athletes and children of alumni have been favored."

"Is this discrimination?" Jacobson said. "It's hard to say because it does serve a social good."

"At any rate, that athlete alumni's child or minority may be taking the place of someone who qualified," he said.

concerned groups and decide if he will accept the proposal.

Bowen said he currently supports the proposed requirements. "I am generally supporting," Bowen said. "There is a public relations problem that, nationally, similar requirements in other colleges have baggage."

"Some universities do not use them as we intend to, which is to provide information on cultural understanding, not political correctness," he said. "There is controversy because people do not understand what requirement actually is."

Dr. Woodrow Jones, dean of the College of Liberal Arts, said much of the controversy surrounding the issue centers on the proposed U.S. cultures requirement.

"People are concerned with what is taught in classes and the impact it will have on the learning of students," Jones said. "Much of this concern is of a political nature rather than academic."

"The courses (which can be applied to this requirement) are the courses we teach now, but in the eyes of some people, they become politically charged when in fact they are not."

Parrish said an international requirement similar to the one proposed for the University has been introduced this year for liberal arts majors.

The College of Liberal Arts also requested approval for a U.S. cultures requirement similar to the one being proposed for the University.

Parrish said the college cannot act on an American cultures requirement until the University decides if it will add a similar requirement to its curriculum.

"The committee's study will affect how the liberal arts college proceeds," Parrish said. "If the University moves forward, the college requirement will be folded into that. If the University does not proceed, the liberal arts college will still have a set of requirements as its goal."

Jones said the liberal arts college's American cultures requirement states that courses should cover racial, ethnic, and gender issues.

He said, however, the University proposal is more restrictive because it states that courses should cover racial, ethnic issues and the problems of American women, rather than simply gender issues.

Jones said the liberal arts college's international requirement is some ways more restrictive than the University's proposal.

"The liberal arts requirement is more restrictive on what is international," he said. "The majority of our courses must be international while only a percentage of the college's proposal must be international."

Jones said the liberal arts college has added an international requirement because the college believes this requirement is essential to the education of its students.


"The College of Liberal Arts is meant to serve the students," Jones said. "It is part of our mission to broaden the base of knowledge of students and prepare them for the world."

Parrish said most liberal arts students already take courses that would fall under the proposed U.S. cultures requirement.

"An overwhelming number of liberal arts students already meet some form of this requirement," Parrish said. "A small percentage not. This requirement would catch the number who slip through."
