Defaults

"We want students to pay their federal loans because it directly affects our ability to disburse funds," Falks said.

When schools have a loan default rate of 25 percent or higher for three years, they risk losing eligibility to participate in the government's primary loan program, the Federal Family Education Loan Program. A&M's default rate has hovered around five percent for several

"We aren't too concerned about losing our eligibility, but we want to keep our default

said.

In 1992, FFELP allowed unsubsidized loans, loans that require interest payments by the student instead of the government, to be disbursed to students not qualifying for subsidized loans. This action increased the loan volume at A&M by 45 percent, Falks said.

"We don't anticipate an increase in our default rate due to the unsubsidized loans, but that is yet to be seen," Falks said. "It could go up, but A&M students have always been very responsible about their loan payments. They make good money when they leave here."

Students who don't repay their loans can expect their

rate as low as possible," Falks wages to be garnished and the credit history to be severely fected.
