# Business college awaits move

## New building to provide advantages

The upcoming move of the College of Business from the Blocker Building to the newly built Wehner Building on West Campus will provide business students and faculty with modern facilities and equipment and more space.

Dr. Benton Cocanougher, dean of business administra-tion, said the Wehner Building will be open in time for spring semester classes.

"Most of the moving will be done over the semester break," Cocanougher said. "A few nondepartmental entities will be moving at the beginning of December, but most of the college will move at the end of the semester or over the break."

Dr. Dean Wichern, associate dean of business administration, said the classroom facili-ties in the Wehner Building will be more technologically advanced than the facilities in Blocker

Podiums at the front of each classroom will give instructors control of extensive audio-visual systems, including computergenerated displays.

Cocanougher said the classrooms are well-designed for all multimedia uses.

"The classrooms are state of the art," Cocanougher said. "They will all have audio-visual capabilities. They're really first class.
