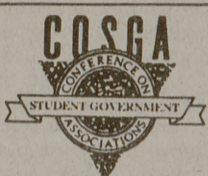

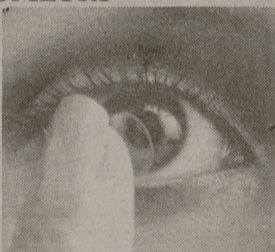
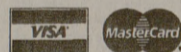

Business college awaits move
New building to provide advantages

The upcoming move of the College of Business from the Blocker Building to the newly built Wehner Building on West Campus will provide business students and faculty with modern facilities and equipment and more space.

Dr. Benton Cocanougher, dean of business administration, said the Wehner Building will be open in time for spring semester classes.

"Most of the moving will be done over the semester break," Cocanougher said. "A few non-departmental entities will be moving at the beginning of December, but most of the college will move at the end of the semester or over the break."

Dr. Dean Wichern, associate dean of business administration, said the classroom facilities in the Wehner Building will be more technologically advanced than the facilities in Blocker.

Podiums at the front of each classroom will give instructors control of extensive audio-visual systems, including computer-generated displays.

Cocanougher said the classrooms are well-designed for all multimedia uses. "The classrooms are state of the art," Cocanougher said. "They will all have audio-visual capabilities. They're really first class."

Many of the classrooms will be case-style, on tiers, where the instructor will be able to walk down the middle of the room.

Faculty members will benefit

from the relocation because of the improved computing infrastructure, which will give them better computing links at their desktop computers.

Julie Gilliam, a member of the business fraternity Alpha Kappa Psi, said student organizations will also benefit from the relocation.

"It will be more organized," Gilliam said. "Instead of boards to publicize on, we'll have cubicles, like in the Koldus Building."

Mary Frontiera, president of the business student council, said the new building will be an advantage to both students and the College of Business.

"The atmosphere will be different," Frontiera said. "The organizations will be more together. You'll be able to talk to people, instead of just looking

at the display boards.

"The new building will also help establish credibility for the college," she said. "We'll stand out more to companies and corporations from a recruiting standpoint. It's a great opportunity for the College of Business."

Cocanougher said one of the main reasons for moving the College of Business is the lack of space in the Blocker Building.

A&M currently has the second largest undergraduate business program in the nation, and the College of Business has almost doubled in student enrollment since moving into Blocker in 1980.

The College of Business will be the sole occupant of the four-story, 190,000-square-foot Wehner Building.

The relocation will not only provide more room for business classes, organizations and activities, but will also reduce overcrowding in Blocker.

Glenn Dowling, director of Academic Enhancement, said the departments of English, speech communication, the arts, philosophy and humanities and statistics will have more space in the building.

Dowling said the departments of the College of Science, the College of Liberal Arts and the Department of Agricultural Economics will move into Blocker in 1990.

Part of the math department will also move into the building, but they will remain in the current space in the Blocker Building.
