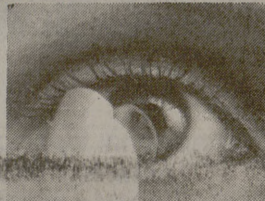

**A&M offensive linemen improve performance**

Excellent pass protection allows Pullig to throw for 191 yards, two touchdowns

What a difference a week makes.

A week after being rescued by the heroics of Leeland McElroy against LSU, the offensive line of the Texas A&M football team became a team strength, helping Corey Pullig to his finest day ever at Kyle Field, as A&M rambled past Oklahoma Saturday.

Offensive coordinator Steve Ensminger said he was very pleased with the marked improvement of the line from week to week.

"They did just an outstanding job," Ensminger said. "We demanded more from them this week, we told them we have got to throw the ball. They had to perform and they did so outstandingly."

In just its second game under Ensminger's new system, the offense churned out the balanced attack that Ensminger had been hoping for. A&M recorded 168 yards rushing and 191 passing, while holding the

ball for a nearly 35 minutes.

While the running game was its usual consistent self Saturday afternoon, the passing game took another big step forward, as Pullig completed 17 of 30 passes for 191 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions. Although Pullig was sacked three times by the Oklahoma defense, the sacks usually came because the Oklahoma defense had tightened up on A&M's receivers, not because the line was missing its blocks.

Senior tight end James McKeehan, who helped protect Pullig while catching four passes for 40 yards, including the touchdown that gave the Aggies a 26-14 lead, said the offensive line should continue to improve as the season goes on.

"The offensive line really got together," McKeehan said. "The more reps they get, the better they'll get at reading the blocking schemes. There's a lot of talent (on the line), and they'll be some great players as they continue to work together."

As expected, sophomore center Calvin Collins, the only

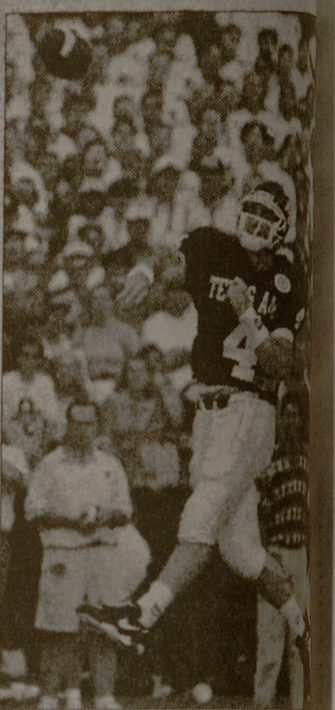
returning starter from last season, again led the charge for the line. Head football coach R.C. Slocum was very pleased with the performance of both Collins and his mates on the line.

"There's a lot of good personnel and personalities (on the line)," Slocum said.

"Calvin has done a real job since moving from guard to center, he's only a sophomore, but he's already a veteran."

After last year's 44-14 thrashing at the hands of the Sooners, with four All-Southwest Conference honorees on the line, one would figure the Aggie line would be in for a rough game against a tough Sooner defense, but as McKeehan explained, inexperience does not necessarily equal poor playing.

"We have so many new players, heck I'm a new player," McKeehan said. "Just because guys are young, it doesn't mean we can't play. It feels so great for us to come together, especially in the fourth quarter, and come away with the win today."

**Cowboys beat Houston for state bragging rights**

IRVING, Texas (AP) — The two-time Super Bowl champion Cowboys held off Bucky Richardson in his first NFL start and beat the Houston Oilers 20-17 Sunday.

While Richardson had the Cowboys worried, Dallas still managed four sacks and two interceptions in their home-opener. Richardson was

subbing for Cody Carlson, who wasn't activated after sustaining a separated left shoulder last week.

Emmitt Smith, who had 171 yards last week in going for his fourth straight NFL rushing title, had 90 yards on 27 carries on Sunday. Richardson completed 20 of 42 passes for 242 yards, while Troy Aikman was 14 of 25 for 228 yards.

Darren Woodson and Charles Haley had interceptions for the Cowboys (2-0), who beat Houston (0-2) in the regular season for the first time since 1985. But Richardson took Houston on two touchdown drives and his scrambling kept the Oilers in the game.

**Montana prevails over old team in first meeting**

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — In Joe Montana's first game against the team he took to four Super Bowl victories, Montana threw two touchdowns passes to lead the Kansas City Chiefs over the 49ers 24-17 Sunday.

Montana, 19 of 31 for 203 yards, got a big boost from Derrick Thomas and the defense. Thomas had three sacks, one of them for a safety, against a banged up San Francisco line.

After the sack, the Chiefs went on a 17-point run over a 10-minute span of the second and third quarters. David Whitmore, traded from the 49ers with Montana, got in the act, too, making a touchdown-saving tackle of Steve Young with under six minutes to go and forcing San Fran-

cisco to kick a field goal.

But overall, it was Montana's victory as the Chiefs moved to 0. He had a 1-yard TD pass to Joe Valerio and an 8-yarder to Keith Cash.

And he certainly fared better than Young, who took Montana's job when he injured his knee and kept it after he recovered. That forced the Montana trade to Kansas City 16 months ago.

Young was 24 of 34 for 147 yards and a touchdown, but little help from his teammates. He was sacked four times, threw two interceptions and fumbled once.

Another fumble, by San Francisco's John Taylor with 2:21 left, sealed the 49ers' fate as they dropped to 1-1.

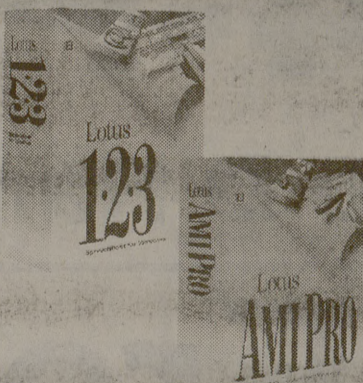
