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

the Career Center. Another service the Career Center offers is in the cooperative education program.

Pat White, assistant director in the cooperative education program, said the program is a multiple-work experience program.

"The student goes to orientation with the co-op office and then registers with a disk,' White said.

"Usually, the student alter-nates work and school," she said. In the co-op program, students alternate between working one semester and attending school. Students usually work for three terms, White said.

"Students usually see the company through one year of op-eration," White said.

"It is like a good, year-long interview with the company," she said.


White said there are generally more students from the technical, engineering areas in the co-op program. However, the coop program also provides opportunities for other majors, such as liberal arts, White said.


"The co-op program provides a wonderful opportunity for students," she said.

Turner said the improving economy has helped students find jobs. "Last year, we coordinated almost 8,000 interviews, an 8 per-cent increase over last year,"
